

AS BIG SCANDAL BREAKS IN CITY

Graft of Half Million From Draft Dodgers and Favor Seekers Alleged.

HIGH OFFICER IS ACCUSED

Lieutenant-Commander, Many Times Under Charges, Has Strange Immunity.

There is one commanding officer, with the rank of Lieutenant-Commander, of a naval base at an American port who has had forty-seven charges lodged against him by various naval investigators during the war. The charges, many of them very serious, were told in detail in fifty-eight affidavits sworn to by the investigators. Nevertheless, for some mysterious reason—probably will become known in the course of the sweeping investigation now being made by the Navy Department of corrupt practices—the commanding officer never has been held to account to the extent of a court martial.

Silence Shrouds Scandals.

The facts about this officer and others now under arrest have not been made public to the extent of a court martial. He is still in charge of the naval base, which was and is being managed so frantically that it is known as "the madhouse." The officer who so far has been free even from court-martial has been accused of drunkenness on duty, possession of confidential information which resulted at one time in prostituting him with pneumonia—conduct unbecoming an officer, attempted suicide while drunk and questionable financial dealings.

Officers' Sudden Absences.

Finally Chief Yeoman McKinley, son of the late Police Capt. McKinley of Flatbush, was detailed to make a preliminary investigation of the drunken charges against the lieutenant-commander. McKinley returned in his evidence to Commander Rittenhouse, who is said for information for the district and Commander Rittenhouse immediately began an investigation of his own.

No Annapolis Men Involved.

In the report of Major John G. Muir, who is now here in charge of the investigation of all the charges lodged against officers and men of the Third Naval District in the local naval district, it is not clear from Special Investigator Muir's report that Beck was mixed up in the Davis case. It should be noted that the name of the name of "regular"—Annapolis graduate—naval officer in the Third or any other district has figured in the slightest way in the investigation.
