WHAT'S IN A NAME?


Here's how a New York daily answers Shakespeare's great question:

5,046 YANKEES CAPTURED.

303 Died While in German Prison Camps.

WASHINGTON, March 25.—Official records of prisoners of war captured by the Central Powers from the American forces, the War Department announced today, shows that there are 156 prisoners whose status was still doubtful on March 25. A list of these names has been forwarded to the central records office, A. E. F., for checking and investigation.

Three Tobacco Barns Burned.

SUFFIELD, Conn., March 25.—A large quantity of tobacco was destroyed today when three barns in West Suffield, owned by the Granby Tobacco Company, fifteen tons of tobacco, farming tools and other material also were destroyed. The loss was placed at \$10,000. The fire is believed to have been caused by sparks from a locomotive.

FOCH TO PREPARE FOR FRESH PERILS

Marshal Takes Up Situation in Eastern Europe.

PARIS, March 25.—Marshal Foch called at the headquarters of the Italian delegation this evening in connection with possible military measures discussed by the council, in view of the grave situation in eastern Europe.

M. Bratiano, the Rumanian Premier, speaking of events in eastern Europe today expressed the view that Bolshevism might soon extend to Serbia, because of race relationship with Russia, and to Slavonia and Croatia because of the Rumanian boundary fixed by the Rumanian treaty of 1916.

It is known here that Count Karolyi's Government in Hungary is ascribed to both internal and external causes.

EXPECT ACTION NOW AGAINST BOLSHEVIKI

ALLIES LIKELY TO BE AROUSED BY HUNGARY SITUATION.

WASHINGTON, March 25.—Reports of an increasing seriousness of the situation in Hungary led to an opinion expressed today by an official of the State Department that "the time had come for the allied nations represented at Paris to take a definite and firm stand against Bolshevism."

Little news of an official nature was received during the day, but dispatches from Paris indicated that grave apprehension was felt there over the situation.

Representatives of the United States in Vienna reported today that the Food Administration had one or two agents in Budapest and it was stated that they might be other Americans there.

It is believed here, is due to the occupation by French troops of the neutral zones between the Czechoslovak and Hungarian and Rumanian and Hungary.

It is believed here that probably the French members of the interallied mission in Budapest were advised, as has been reported in news despatches from Vienna, but doubt was expressed as to the inclusion of Americans or British in the interment order.

It was said by officials that if the Hungarians actually had declared war upon the Entente Powers as was threatened in the State Department's public yesterday, it would be a threat move for the Hungarians to attempt to reach the Adriatic and recover a portion of the Austrian navy now in the hands of the Jugo-Slavs.

Hungarian leaders, it was said, undoubtedly would recognize the advantage to be gained by striking immediately toward the Adriatic before the authorities in Paris had time to act.

The question as to whether Hungary's acceptance of Bolshevism had its inspiration from German sources is a matter of great interest to the State Department officials, although it was said that it would be an experiment of great interest to Germany, as it would at once put the Allies in the test as to their attitude toward Bolshevism.
