Noted Jockey Dies in Hospital as Result of Spill in Sixth Race--Others Hurt.

Baltimore, Md., April 4.—Frankie Robinson, America's premier jockey, is dead. He died in the Johns Hopkins Hospital here today.

Robinson, under contract to Harry Payne Whitney, and one of the highest earning riders in the United States, had a spurring horse torn in his skull.

The accident occurred when a field of eight horses dashed to the first turn in a race of a mile and twenty yards for four-year-olds and a mixup followed at the sharp turn.
