

GOVERNOR URGED TO BOON PUBLIC WORK

Reconstruction Commission in Report Finds No Hope in Private Sources.

IDLENESS IS SERIOUS

Uncertainty and Lack of Confidence Are Said to Mark Business

Business generally reflects uncertainty and lack of confidence.

The unemployment situation is serious. Nothing can be definitely expected from private business to improve.

Recommendations to Governor. It recommends that as a means of improving the situation Gov. Smith do the following things:

1. Urge heads of State departments at Albany to expedite public works authorized for which funds are available.

2. Have a bill introduced carrying an authorization and appropriation for the construction at Saratoga Springs of a bathhouse, drink hall and other buildings mentioned.

3. Urge the Highway Department to submit immediately its programme to the Secretary of Agriculture and a bill for an additional appropriation in case present State funds are insufficient to enable the State to take advantage of the Federal aid.

4. Call a conference of county supervisors and of county superintendents, to urge them to provide funds for work contemplated or interrupted for which funds are not available, to commence immediately work held up for other reasons than lack of funds, and, if possible, to enlarge their building programme.

5. Call a conference of mayors of the various cities of the State (excepting the City of New York, which is provided for in Section 6) to urge them to provide funds for all public improvements contemplated or interrupted for which funds are not yet available; to overcome obstacles to the carrying out of public works in the case of work which has been started but for which funds are available; to enlarge their programme, if possible; and to consider, if possible, the unemployment problem in their localities to the public works programme.

6. Urge the authorities of the City of New York not only to stimulate all the usual repairs and extensions of public works for which appropriations have been made in whole or in part, but also the following specific projects:

A. Rapid street construction. B. Proper development of the port of New York which can to a very considerable extent be done by means of funds appropriated to the Dock Department. C. Immediate building of a garbage disposal plant or plants.

D. Immediate appropriation for the building or terminating of public structures not requiring the purchase of additional land, such as outlined by the City Markets Commission, but including the building of temporary structures on city owned land in the Bronx and Queens.

E. The adoption of plans and specification of the estimated sum for preliminary work on several of the projects for the Boroughs of Manhattan, Bronx, Brooklyn and Queens.

Building Operations Lag. The report sets forth that the removal of wartime restraint has caused no large scale resumption of building operations. In 1918 the estimated cost of new buildings for which contracts were filed in the five boroughs of New York City amounted to \$191,071,924. In 1917, \$80,325,512; in 1918, \$28,636,544, and in the first three months of this year, \$14,559,718.

The commission gives these figures showing how wages in the building industry have increased from 1915 to 1917. Bricklayer, \$5 to \$7; carpenter, \$5 to \$6; painter, \$5 to \$7; elevator constructor, \$2.50 to \$5, and so on.
