

PAGE SEES ORLANDO THEN WIRES WILSON Hope Is Expressed in Paris That Adriatic Problem Will Be Solved.

ITALY BACKING PREMIER Wilson Blamed for Split Over Claims—Legislators Indorse Demands.

Rome, April 30.—The Associated Press, the American Ambassador, had a long interview on the Adriatic situation today with Premier Orlando and Foreign Minister Sonnino, after which he sent a telegraphic report to Paris, giving a full account of the point of view of the Italian Government.

The Italian newspapers are less vehement in their attacks on President Wilson, though the Messaggero sarcastically refers to him as "Prof. Wilson," while the Tempo speaks of "President Wilson's obstinate savagery."

The Chamber, the guardian of the dignity and the interpreter of the will of the Italian people, declares itself in unqualified confidence in the Premier and confirms its full confidence in it for the defense of the supreme rights of the nation and for securing a just and durable peace.

Wilson's Words a Surprise. Premier Orlando showed great regret for such a hypothesis, adding he would do everything in his power to prevent it. He said he thought it opportune and useful that France and England should undertake to find a means of conciliation which would leave the question unexamined by his experts to see if further concessions could be made to Italian aspirations.

SOUTH SLAV TROOPS INVADE CARINTHIA
