

COL. HAYWARD AND MRS. PLANT MARRY

Wed in Bride's Apartment in Plaza, Then Go to Bar Harbor.

FEW WITNESS CEREMONY Pair Friends 15 Years—Third Marriage for Bride, Second for Him.

Col. William Hayward of the late 49th United States Infantry and Mrs. May Caldwell Plant, widow of Commodore Merton F. Plant, were married yesterday afternoon in the bride's apartment in the Hotel Plaza. The ceremony was performed by Capt. John V. Axton, Jr., a Congregationalist clergyman who recently returned from his chaplain's duties overseas and who has been a close friend of Col. Hayward.

The marriage had been expected by the friends of Col. and Mrs. Hayward, who had observed the rapid development of the romance, which began after the Colonel, loaded with honors from the French republic and from his own country, returned to this country with the Fourth French Army under the redoubtable Gen. Gouraud. There had been, however, an acquaintance of fifteen years between Col. Hayward and the former Mrs. Plant.

Few at Wedding. They obtained a marriage license at 1 P. M. in City Clerk Souley's private office and then drove to the Hotel Plaza, where a small company of relatives and friends were waiting with Capt. Axton. These included Dr. and Mrs. McTearney, brother-in-law and sister of the bride; Mrs. Plant's son, Phillip Morgan Plant, Col. Hayward's son, Leland; his sister, Mrs. Martha M. Lowe of Colorado Springs, his uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. Eugene B. Howe of New York City, and Father John Kelly, in whose charitable activities Mrs. Hayward has been much interested. After the ceremony, which was solemnized at 1 P. M., Col. and Mrs. Hayward left for their summer home at Bar Harbor.

Mrs. Hayward is the daughter of the late Senator and Mrs. Martin Caldwell of Hartford, Conn., and is 39 years old. On her mother's side she is descended from the Morgan family of New England, her grandfather having been Capt. Edwin Morgan and her mother, Eugenia Morgan. On her father's side she is a descendant of Gen. Benjamin Butler. She was born at Wetherfield, Conn., was educated at Woodstock, Vt., and for several years studied music under foreign masters. Her first husband was Merton F. Plant, proprietor of the "Vegetable Hotel," Bar Harbor, Me., from whom she secured a divorce April 21, 1914. On June 17, 1914, she was married to Commodore Merton F. Plant, a well-known yachtsman and a baseball team for New London, a city in which he took great interest and for whom well being he accomplished a great deal. He was killed in action during the Boer War, as well as the New London Telegraph, and had many other large and varied interests.

An exponent of the old traditions of American enterprise in the Far East, there has passed away in the person of Mr. Webb one of the last survivors of the business men of the former generation of New Yorkers, and one of the best representatives of the type of merchant characteristic of that era.
