

WONDERFUL DEVELOPMENT OF A GREAT STATE PARK

35,000 Acres Developed by Palisades Interstate Park Commission Offers Thousands of New Yorkers Most Amazing Recreation Facilities.

There is a revelation in store for any motorist who has not visited Palisades Interstate Park, that wonderful tract of superb mountain country comprising about 35,000 acres on the west side of the Hudson River. One part of this great park embraces a twelve mile strip from a point opposite 158th street at Fort Lee to a point opposite Dobbs Ferry. Then there are the Hook Mountain properties embracing mountains, lakes and water frontage for about four and one-half miles between Nyack and Haverstraw. And finally there are those superb Bear Mountain and Hazytonic sections (30,000 acres) extending from the Hudson River west about seven miles into the Ramapo Mountains. The Blauvelt Rifle Range about 33 acres now devoted to the military training of the boys—also is State property.

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PREPARING FOR THAT MOTOR TOUR ROUTE OF WEEK END CONNECTICUT TOUR

One Who Knows Tells What You Should Do and Have. Trip of 220 Miles Recommended by Automobile Club Bureau.

With the advent of the warm days and nights of June comes also the automobile tour. Of course, because of the fine weather of the spring there have been many touring parties already, but they have been chiefly seen on trips; now comes the tour. It may be made a delightful experience treasured away in memory or a series of frightful, fatiguing events, a nightmare, we recall it later. It depends not upon luck or fortuitous circumstances but upon preparation, personal and material.

A pleasant trip of some 220 miles, giving a great variety of scenery through hilly country and passing a number of pretty lakes, is the following: Starting from Columbus Circle, the route continues north on Broadway to Forty Square in Yonkers, then turning left through the square and just beyond turning right up hill continues on Broadway, where a fine view of the Hudson River is obtained.

Pick Your Sunday Ride From This List

Seven Enjoyable Short Motor Tours Suggested by the Touring Bureau of the Automobile Club of America.

10 MILES ALONG THE BOSTON POST ROAD, RETURNING THE BEDFORD HILLS. North on Fifth avenue, Madison avenue, across the 158th Street Bridge and turn left into Mott avenue, which becomes the Grand Concourse or Woodrow Wilson Boulevard. Turn right into Fordham road, which becomes Pelham Parkway and the Shore road, followed to New Rochelle from New Rochelle to the Croton Post road is followed through Larchmont and Mamaroneck to Rye. Continue straight on along the Boston Post road through Port Chester, across the Byram Bridge, entering Connecticut. Straight on through Greenwich and Stamford. Through Main street in Stamford and continue through Danbury and Noroton to Newark, which is entered on Wall street, and a left turn is made into Main street, Valley Forge and north along the Norwalk Valley through South Wilton, Wilton, Canon and Georgetown to Branchville, which is the end of the road. From Branchville, which is called the prettiest town in New England, with a village street 200 feet wide with towering oaks and maples, their foliage forming a canopy over the southwest through South Salem to Cross River, entering a pretty section of the Water Shed District, then south through Bedford and Armonk to the extreme north end of Kensico Park. From this point, purchase a ticket and follow to Rye, then along the Boston Post road through Mamaroneck, Larchmont and New Rochelle, entering New York City via Pelham Parkway, Fordham road, Woodrow Wilson Boulevard, then south through Central Park.

take ferry to Perth Amboy. From ferry straight on Smith street, turn right into Amboy avenue, which becomes Middlesex avenue, and follow through Woodbridge into St. George's avenue, through Ranney into Rahway avenue, Elizabeth Frelinghuysen avenue is followed from Elizabeth to Newark, and the Newark Plank road to the Hudson County House, then north on the boulevard to Weehawken. At small red church and cemetery turn right into Third street, continue to Fort second street ferry. From ferry follow Forty-second street to Broadway.

ROAD NOTES TO THE BERKSHIRES

Surveyed by the Automobile Club of America. Motorists leaving New York via Central avenue will encounter construction just beyond Yonkers avenue. The road is also closed between Harts Corners and White Plains, the detour for White Plains being to turn right at Harts Corners and cross railroad at Hartdale station. Take the first left turn into Walworth avenue and follow to White Plains. For Elmford and the Saw Mill River road turn left and follow winding road to Elmford.

A SIXTY MILE RUN ACROSS STATEN ISLAND, RETURNING VIA ELIZABETH AND NEWARK.

Go south on Fifth avenue to Washington Square, turn left into Fourth street, then into Broadway and excellent scenery. Run north on Broadway to Manhattan avenue. Turn left to 14th street, ferry. From ferry continue to top of Fort Lee Hill, turn left and go through Fort Lee and Leonia to Hackensack, turn right into Main street and left into Passaic avenue, then north through Arden, Hoboken, Alendale, Suffern, Gladstone and Tuxedo. Just beyond the north gate to Tuxedo Park turn right on the main highway. Follow winding road to Bear Mountain, then south along the Hudson River through Haverstraw to Congers. At small white church turn left, follow main road around Rockland to Nyack, then down through Sparkill, Tappan, Chester and Tenafly to Englewood. Turn left into Palisades avenue, then over Tappan street ferry to Broadway and turn left downtown.

NEW YORK TO GREENPORT, I. L. VIA THE NORTH SHORE.

Cross the Queensboro Bridge and follow Jackson avenue to Flushing, then out to North Hempstead turnpike, through: 17 Manhasset, 18 Roseton, 19 Brookville, 20 East Norwich, 21 Cold Spring Harbor, 22 Huntington, 23 Centerville, 24 Northport, 25 Commack, 26 Stony Brook, 27 Port Jefferson, 28 Shoreham, 29 Wading River, 30 Riverhead, 31 Jamesport, 32 Mattituck, 33 Southold, 34 Greenport. Connections are available by boat to New London, eastern point and the towns on the Boston road.
