

**RIOT AND LOOT  
BY HOOLIGANS  
IN LIVERPOOL**

Shops Wrecked and Police  
Battled in Two Nights  
of Outlawry.

SOLDIERS PATROL CITY  
Half of Police Still on Strike  
—Hundreds of Citizens Are  
Enlisted in War.

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LIVERPOOL, AUG. 3.—Central Liver-  
pool to-night, as a result of the police  
strike, presents a war picture, as there  
have been firing and death. Troops pa-  
trol the streets and vast crowds gather  
and gaze on the scenes of an orgy of  
destruction last night. There are mili-  
tary lorries containing complements of  
armed men awaiting any call that may  
be made and grimest and most stung-  
rant of all, several tanks.

Root stores, jewelry shops and furni-  
ture houses were smashed, looted and  
wrecked last night. London road to-  
day is the Tyres of Liverpool.

The trouble began late on Friday  
night when several shops were wrecked.  
Hooligans of the Scotland road and  
dock areas took advantage of the depen-  
dence of the police force and let them-  
selves go. Last night's developments  
were worse than was anticipated, for it  
was thought that the presence in town  
of 900 soldiers might have a salutary  
effect. Anarchy broke loose, and even  
in Liverpool's unfortunate history of  
strikes troubles the position was ap-  
parently never more serious.

Citizens Are Enrolled.

The streets were crowded more dense-  
ly than usual. Citizens were asked to  
enroll themselves as constables. Sol-  
diers were on guard at spots where dis-  
turbances were deemed likely and a con-  
don was drawn across London road,  
where it faces St. George's Plateau.

It was in London road that the storm  
broke shortly before midnight, although  
there had been reports of earlier looting  
in Scotland road, Great Homer street  
and parts of West Derby road. The  
first in London road was an at-  
tack on the premises of a Jeweller,  
where looters after smashing a window  
got away with valuables. Gangs of  
youths and young men proceeded along  
the thoroughfare stopping first at one  
shop and then at another; the air re-  
sounding with the crash of the huge  
plate glass windows. The looters car-  
ried pieces of iron, heavy stones and  
other missiles which they used to de-  
molish the panes, while in some cases  
doors were pried open with the ease and  
ingenuity of cracksmen.

The roadway was littered with goods,  
from watches to costumers' dummies.  
It was done quickly and only a short  
distance from the guard of soldiers.  
The City Magistrate arrived and sol-  
diers made an advance up London road  
with bayonets levelled. The marauders  
took to their heels up side streets, but  
with the most daring audacity quickly  
came into the open again, after the  
troops had advanced up the road, and  
resumed their smashing work. Mean-  
while a contingent of detectives and  
specials on police duty arrived on the  
scene and did excellent work in check-  
ing the efforts of the looters. In one  
males a detective sergeant was severely  
hurt.

Light Shops to Loot.

As showing the daring of the shop-  
breakers it may be mentioned that cer-  
tain establishments were all in darkness  
when attacked, but the men soon facil-  
itated their own work by turning on the  
electric light in order to find articles.  
There was thus to be seen a picture of  
shops fully illuminated, huge rents in  
the windows and thieves passing from  
one department to another. The mob  
even made pretences to system in one  
district. Rough looking women out for  
loot kept coming into this district and  
indicated which shops were likely centres  
for spoil. Then the youths went upon  
their work of spoliation. This was the  
spree adopted in the whole length of  
London road.

Beyond charges were the order of  
the night, for while events were going  
forward in London road the Scotland  
road and Great Homer street areas were  
centres of similar troubles. Many  
shops, principally grocers, boot and  
clothing establishments, were being  
sacked, and in this locality the sum-  
total of the damage and loot was on  
a far greater scale than the previous  
evening. So serious did the state of  
affairs become here that a volley of  
rifles was fired.

There was a recrudescence of trouble  
this morning when a concerted attack  
was made upon the premises of a firm  
of bottlers of Vauxhall road. Hun-  
dreds forced their way into the premises  
helped themselves to all kinds of avail-  
able liquor and soon many were over-  
come by their potations. Handcarts  
were forthcoming and on these stores  
that could not be carted were taken  
away. Later children of the looters  
ventured into the streets in droves  
and sold bottles of beer and stout for  
a penny.

For a time the orgy could not be com-  
bated by the authorities and the de-  
bauch closed when the supplies had  
run out and numerous looters were  
left in drunken slumber in the streets.

Volleys Are Fired.

This evening in Love lane, in the  
north end of Liverpool, during a third  
raid on bottling stores in this district,  
a military lorry with soldiers came up  
and caught the looters red handed. An-  
other body of soldiers arrived almost  
immediately and one detachment started  
back for headquarters with the prisoners  
in a lorry. The prisoners were stoned  
and mobbed by the crowd and warning  
shots were fired. As those did not have  
the desired effect a further volley was  
fired and one man fell badly wounded.

At a mass meeting of trade unionists  
to-night attended by some 500 people, in-  
cluding soldiers, sailors and women, a  
resolution was passed sympathizing with  
the police and prison officers, some  
unions declaring for strike policy in pro-  
test against the Government's attack on  
trade unions. The Mayor to-night is-  
sued a notice asking citizens to enroll  
as special constables for one month to  
protect lives and property. Warning is  
given that further disturbance will en-  
tail the gravest penalties, as the  
military powers will be actively used.

Official figures show that 929 Liver-  
pool police are on strike and 952 on  
duty. Special constables to the number  
of 520 have been enrolled and numerous  
police pensioners have been reengaged.  
The authorities are in session contin-  
uously. More soldiers have arrived and  
there is every indication that stern  
measures will be taken if necessary.

600 Engine Drivers Strike.

LONDON, Monday, Aug. 4.—One of the  
London branches of the Associated Loc-  
omotive Engineers struck at midnight,  
says the Herald this morning. Six hun-  
dred of the men went out.




