or to have begun hostilities or to have taken any hostile step short of war, in regard to any dispute which has been decided adversely to it by arbitrators, the contracting Powers hereby engage not to cease all commerce and intercourse with that Power but also to unite in blocking and closing the frontiers of that Power to commerce and intercourse with any part of the world and to use any force which may be agreed upon to accomplish that object.

LETTER OF THE PRESIDENT

The letter of transmittal from the President accompanying the American draft follows: MY DEAR MR. CHAIRMAN: I have at last been able to get personally over the great mass of papers which remained in my hands bearing upon my stay in Paris, and am disappointed to find that it is in no respect a complete file, the complete file remaining with the American commission.

POWER OF INTERVENTION

It is hereby also declared and agreed to be the jointly right of each of the contracting Powers to draw the attention of the body of the delegates of the executive council to any circumstance anywhere which threatens to disturb international peace or the good understanding between nations upon which peace depends.

The body of delegates also may meet at such other times and places as they may deem best and determine.

Article IX, X, XI, and XII all relate to the manner in which the contracting Powers shall be followed in dealing with nations not members of the League.

Article XIII binds the contracting Powers to observe all treaty obligations inconsistent with the terms of the covenant and to agree not to enter into any engagements inconsistent therewith.

Under the head of supplementary agreements there are ten additional articles. The first three of these provide for mandates for the German colonies and "to those territories formerly belonging to Turkey which include Armenia, Kurdistan, Syria, Mesopotamia, Palestine and Arabia."

Article IV provides that no new State shall be recognized by the League or admitted to its membership except that its armament conform to standards prescribed by the League.

Article V pledges the contracting Powers to work to establish and maintain fair hours and humane conditions of labor.

Article VI empowers the executive council to exact guarantees for all racial and national minorities from States seeking admission to the League.

Article VII pledges the contracting Powers to permit the free exercise of religion.

An effort to get the freedom of the seas doctrine embodied in the covenant was made in article VIII, which provides for the rights of belligerents on the high seas outside territorial waters shall have been defined by international convention.

The Laurentic, a vessel of 14,822 tons, which was acting as a British auxiliary cruiser, struck a mine off the north coast of Ireland on a later date.
