

BRITISH LABORITES ASSAIL IRISH RULE

Congress at Glasgow Protests Also Against Deporting Red Suspects.

MORE SINN FEIN RAIDS

Parliament Member's Home Is Searched; Tipperary Club Is Forced Into.

GLASGOW, Sept. 13.—The Trades Union Congress adopted to-day an emergency resolution deprecating military rule in Ireland and declaring that the only solution of the Irish problem was through the method of self-determination by which the Irish people could work out their own salvation.

The congress, which has been in session here all week, closed to-day with the passage of resolutions affirming the right of free speech and protesting against the arrest and deportation of alien trade union officials for alleged connection with Bolshevism.

COKE, Sept. 13.—The military and police raids which began yesterday in connection with the proclamation of the suppression of the Sinn Fein Parliament and Sinn Fein organizations throughout Ireland were continued to-day.

TIPPERARY, Sept. 13.—Entrance into the Tipperary Club was forced this morning by soldiers. They found the building unoccupied.

IRISH MEET HERE TO-NIGHT IN PROTEST

Walsh Will Preside and Conboy Will Speak.

A mass meeting to protest against the intention of the British Government to stamp out the republican movement in Ireland by "drastic action" will be held to-night in the Lexington Theatre by Irish sympathizers.

Further Details of Shooting of Hostages by Communists Told in Munich.

BRITISH WOMEN EAGER TO EMIGRATE

Further Details of Shooting of Hostages by Communists Told in Munich.

MUNICH, Sept. 13.—Further details of the shooting of hostages during the Communist regime early in the year have been revealed in the trial here on those accused of the murders.

The last hostage was Prince Thurn and Taxis, who declared he had been expelled from his family in Ratisbon because of his revolutionary views.

Whareupon the Prince again was dragged to the courtyard and put against a wall.

A witness named Debut, who at first professed not to have taken part in the proceedings, was accused by one of the prisoners of having been in the courtyard.

After a long pause he confessed that was true, gave details of the proceedings, admitted having taken pocketbooks and valuables from hostages.

He was arrested and removed from the court in custody on suspicion of being concerned in the murder.

Another witness named Zak described how Hausmann said: "I can show no mercy; I've Seid's strictest order to shoot people."

Hausmann stormed into the gymnasium and brought a number of soldiers out, who placed various people against the wall.

Every time three hostages had been shot he motioned with his hand to Schickelshofer to proceed.

When Countess Westarp was brought forward Schickelshofer said: "She must be shot. We can have no mercy. She must die. Besides, the walls have not treated our heroes any differently."

The witness saw eight hostages shot. The soldiers in the courtyard showed great joy at the hostages being shot and under the housing acts, as he was unable to get other accommodation.

A bullet splashed his brains against the wall, whereupon one soldier cried amid general laughter, "There's baked brains to-day."

One of those shot down moved somewhat, whereupon a soldier went to him and split his skull with a rifle butt, saying, "It's all the same whether he dies this way or that."

A small Saxon soldier, who obviously found Countess Westarp too long in writing her farewell letter, caught hold of her and dragged her to the wall and with others fired on her.

"As she sank down," said the witness, "I held a cry, 'Take care. Mark that you've settled her.'"

The witness described to the sorrow of those present how one of the accused treated the Countess's dead body. The corpses were buried late at night by Seid's orders.
