From up State there will be Senator J. Henry Walters, president pro tem of the Senate; speaker Theodore C. Sweet of the Assembly; Assemblyman Simon J. Adler of Rochester, leader of the majority in the Assembly; Assemblyman Henry E. Macdonald, chairman of the Ways and Means Committee of that body; Senator Henry M. Sage, chairman of the Senate Finance Committee; Assemblyman Louis M. Martin of Onondaga; Assemblyman George R. Pearson of Oneida; and Fred W. Hinman, clerk of the Assembly.

It is possible that Senator Clayton R. Lusk, who is chairman of the special legislative committee to investigate prohibition, also may take part in some of the conference. Chairman George A. Glynn of the State committee will be an important member of the conference.

Health insurance, which has been a stumbling block for several years, has been a matter of public concern. It is a mooted question as to whether they should begin a joint legislative investigation of the traction situation or simply name a committee of the Senate to make inquiries here without the formal legislative hearings. To Consider Prohibition. Another matter that may be brought up in the conference is the question of enforcement of some sort of legislation to enforce the Federal prohibition amendment. It is felt that this question cannot be definitely settled until the United States Supreme Court has passed on some of the phases of the amendment now before it.

Lesislative leaders who were in the city yesterday were surprised to read a story that a bill to legalize the manufacture and sale of ales and beers would be introduced soon after the session opened. They said they had never heard of it.

"I had not even heard the idea suggested," said Speaker Sweet, "and know nothing about any such plan."

The prevailing sentiment is that New York State cannot adopt any legislation that will be less drastic than that approved by Congress.
