How to Set Gate Posts. - Take equal quantities of water-lime and quick-lime, and mix with sand as usual; put two or three inches of mortar and coarse gravel in the bottom of the hole, so the end of the post will not come to the ground, then set your post in, top end down, fill in several inches of coarse gravel, pound it down; then more mortar and more gravel, and so on until the cement is raised above the ground several inches around the post.
