HONEYCOMB GINGERBREAD - Half a pound of flour, half a pound of sugar, a quarter of a pound of butter, half an ounce of ginger, one lemon grated, and the whole of the juice, two pounds of treacle. Mix all together to a paste. Make it thin to spread upon flat tins, rubbed well with butter. Bake it in a moderate oven.
