College Items. Russia has only nine colleges. Harvard has a Chinese professor.

Wellesley's donations amounted last year to \$165,000. Cornell has a library of 40,000 volumes.

Gambetta has been made a doctor of philosophy by the university of Athens. Union college had eleven representatives in the past Congress at Washington.

Andover theological seminary commenced its course this year with about one hundred students. Lasell seminary was obliged to rent extra buildings to accommodate her pupils this term.

By the action of the faculty of the Kentucky Wesleyan college, Monday, instead of Saturday, is kept as the weekly holiday.

Longfellow has presented Cornell university with a cast of the bust of Professor George W. Green, by the sculptor Crawford.

England has four universities; France, fifteen; Germany, twenty-two; and Ohio, with a population of three millions, has thirty-seven.

The oldest college publication is the Yale Literary Magazine, founded in 1829. The first college paper was published in 1809.

A gift of \$20,000 has been made to Washington and Jefferson college, for the purpose of establishing a chair of applied mathematics.

Thomas Halloway, the rich Englishman, is exercising, at his own expense, an institution for the higher education of girls. The building will cost \$1,385,000.

Columbia college has an endowment fund of \$5,000,000; Johns Hopkins university, \$3,000,000; Harvard, \$2,500,000; Princeton, \$1,000,000; Yale, \$550,000.

The University of Lubenigen, Germany, recently celebrated its four hundredth anniversary. Among the graduates are Melancthon, Kepler, Schelling, Hegel, Schiller, and Demmler.

The average annual expenses of a student at Harvard, Yale or Columbia is \$800; Princeton, \$600; Andover, Bowdoin, Brown, Dartmouth or Williams, \$500; Hamilton, \$450, and Michigan University, \$370.

Prof. D. J. Hill, recently inaugurated as president of the University of Lewisburg, Pa., is only twenty-eight years old, and is said to be the youngest college president in the United States.

Williams college has graduated thirty members of Congress, five U. S. senators, eight governors, sixteen judges of the supreme court, thirty-two presidents of colleges, and eight hundred and ninety-four clergymen.
