Raising Potatoes Under Straw.

Occasionally some farmer has great success in producing potatoes by dropping the seed on green sward and covering it with refuse straw, old hay, or other sorts of litter.

The best results are obtained by cutting the potatoes in pieces of suitable size, dropping them on a sod after the grass is a few inches high and covering them to the thickness of six inches with refuse hay, straw or other rubbish.

Another object may be accomplished by planting potatoes on top of the ground. A harsh, tough soil may be subdued and brought into a condition to produce crops another year.
