MINNEAPOLIS, Sept. 10, 1880.

We found our friends Judge J. P. Rea and wife pleasantly located on Nicolette island. They are both in the enjoyment of excellent health and like their new home very much, and enjoy Western life; and while they have made hosts of friends among the best citizens here, they love to refer to their friends they left behind them in old Lancaster, for whom they entertain the warmest friendship. The great event here now is the fair held under the auspices of the Northwestern agricultural exposition, of which Col. Wm. B. King, of Pacific mail steamship company, is the president.

The display is very good, but to one who saw the Centennial exhibition all such things are very much dwarfed. There is a good exhibition of horses and fine cattle, the former principally of Norman stock, which several parties in the state are largely engaged in importing direct from France.

The display in agricultural products is very large; the different railroad companies having large collections from along the line of their respective roads. We noticed one party who had on exhibition two hundred and eighteen varieties of potatoes, many of which were the finest ever saw.

The races, as usual at all fairs, are the principal attraction. The day before we arrived there was a race between two lady equestrians of twenty miles for a purse of \$5,000. The parties were Miss Belle Cook, of California, and Miss Jewett, of Minnesota. During the race Miss Jewett was unhorsed by the turning of the saddle and severely injured. The race was decided in favor of Miss Cook, to whom the money was awarded. Today there is another race between lady equestrians for a purse of \$2,000.

Tribute to Gen. Hancock.

What Leading Republicans Said of Him in 1876.

A True Patriot and a Renowned Soldier, and One to Whom the Honors of the Nation are Due—The Hero of a Hundred Battles.

In Baltimore much comment has been occasioned by publicly being given for the first time to a highly complimentary letter to Gen. Hancock which was presented to him in 1876 by the residents of that city, irrespective of party. The letter, which accompanied a present of a life-size portrait of the recipient, is as follows:

SEPTEMBER 27, 1880.

"Major-Gen. Winfield S. Hancock, U. S. A. in command of the 2nd Cavalry, and in the boom of cannon, the sufferings of the wounded and dying, are no longer heard throughout the land, coming up from sanguinary battlefields, quickening the recollections of the imperishable deeds of these gallant spirits who for four long and bloody years stood bravely up between treason upon the one hand and their country's honor on the other, yet the hearts of a sympathizing people, while turning with a lively gratitude to an overruling Providence for the ultimate triumph given to the cause of justice, righteousness and truth, will ever enucleate with the wreath of sorrow the holy memories of those who have fallen, and place the chaplet of victory upon the scarred and meritorious brows of their surviving comrades. The first defiant note of the rebellion, as it fell like a pall upon the hearts of the people, reached you upon the golden shores of the distant Pacific, where the seeds of treason were promising an abundant harvest and traitors were rejoicing in the prospect of a rich domain, but where, in the emergencies of the occasion, your voice and example were potential in awakening the spirit of patriotism in loyal hearts and in strengthening their adherence to the flag of their country, the integrity of the Union and the rights of man. From thence the eyes of your admiring countrymen and the sympathies of their hearts followed you in your homeward course to the Atlantic, and afterward they accompanied you down through your active participation in the various campaigns in defence of the Union in which you and your brave followers bore so distinguished a part. As a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night you led the invincible columns of your ever-glorious old Second army corps from victory to victory, gathering new glories upon your tattered banners and increased devotion in your unflinching heart with each successive conflict upon a hundred battle fields, by which the names of Yorktown, Williamsburg, Garnetsville, Golding's Farm, Savage Station, White Oak Swamp, Crumpton's Pass, Antietam, Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville, Gettysburg, the Wilderness, Spotsylvania Court House, North Anna River, Totopotomoy Creek, Deep Bottom, in front of Petersburg, Bean's Station, and Boydston Road have been rendered forever memorable and as enduring as the everlasting continent upon which they stand. In surveying the vast array of glorious names and brilliant achievements hewn out with the sword and inscribed with the bayonet by the old Army of the Potomac, upon which coming generations will delight to dwell, the name and deeds of Hancock will forever shine with unborrowed lustre, and carry with them an inspiration elevating in its tone, irresistible in its influence, and lasting in its results upon the future military reputation of our country. Judge Black on Garfield.

The picture which Judge Black is said to have drawn of Garfield's moral character, in the *Philadelphia Press*, is a very remarkable one. He appears to be acquainted with two Garfields having the same Christian names, one of them very good and one of them very bad, one of them an estimable private citizen and one of them a most respectable politician. The first one never swore falsely, and never helped forward an election fraud; while the second one was a Credit Mobilierist, a corrupt congressman, an adviser and abettor of the Louisiana forgeries, and one of the infamous eight on the electoral commission who gave those forgeries the force and effect of law and of fact.

Judge Black also states that the Garfield whom he knows privately is an out-and-out free trader, and is in his heart as good a Democrat as the judge himself; while the other Garfield is a prohibitory tariff man, and a thorough-going Republican partisan, who long since gave the "key of his conscience to his party."

We say there must be two men of this name, for it is manifestly impossible for two such opposite characters to exist in the same person. Judge Black, however, seems to think otherwise, and to have made up his mind that a man may be honest in some relations when he is a second-rate free trader, and in his heart as good a Democrat as the judge himself; while the other Garfield is a prohibitory tariff man, and a thorough-going Republican partisan, who long since gave the "key of his conscience to his party."

But if Judge Black does not draw a bribery and perjury line of distinction, and we emphatically deny that there is any such distinction—between public and private morals, where will he draw it? It is, however, with the public character of James A. Garfield that both he and we are required to deal in this canvass, and of him we understand Judge Black to affirm, upon the strength of a long and intimate acquaintance, that there is no crime he would not commit, and scarcely any that he has not committed, to serve the party that serves him.
