

CITY SCHOOL DIRECTORS.

THIRTEEN MONTHLY MEETING LAST EVENING.

Bill Ordered to be Paid—The City Superintendent's Report—The New Street School Boundary Settled—New Schedule of Salaries of Teachers Adopted.

A stated meeting of the school directors was held Thursday evening, the following named members being present: Messrs. Baker, Golenius, Brennan, Broyles, Brown, Byrne, Cochran, Darmstetter, Eberman, Evans, Hartman, Herr, Johnston, J. M. Johnson, William, Lichty, Marshall, McCormick, McEligott, McKillips, Otlander, Ochs, Raub, Reimann, Ringwald, Schwelb, Shindler, Shirk, Simech, Snyder, Spruiter, Warfel, Wickesham, Levergood, president, and twenty-one others.

The minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Evans from the finance committee presented the following bill, which was ordered to be paid:

Mr. Darmstetter, from the committee on soldiers' orphans, reported that the committee had examined into Mrs. W. K. Adams' application for the admission of her son, Herbert, into the night school at the school, and recommended that the application be granted.

The application was read, and it appearing that Mrs. W. K. Adams was entitled to a Maryland regiment, Dr. Wickesham said the boy was ineligible.

President Levergood said he would decide the boy to be ineligible on another ground; he was not an orphan.

After some further remarks by Dr. Wickesham and Alderman Spruiter, Mr. Hartman moved to refer the matter to the judicial committee with instructions to report.

Mr. Ringwald's report on the night schools, made a verbal report, saying that the girls' night school would be closed after Tuesday next.

The city superintendent's report was read as follows:

LANCASTER, PA., March 5, 1885. To the Board of School Directors.

GENTLEMEN: Your city superintendent submits the following report of the public schools for the month of February.

The whole number of pupils enrolled was 260 in the high schools, 1,049 in the secondary and 1,961 in the primary; total 3,270 and adding 125 night school enrollment, grand total 3,395.

The average attendance was 247 in the high school, 866 in the secondary, 1,512 in the primary; total 2,625. The average attendance in the schools as before, the grand total is 2,745. The average percentage of attendance was 94. The number of visits made by the city superintendent was 110.

The number of visits made by directors was 120 as follows: S. K. Lichty 2, Dr. M. L. Herr 2, J. B. W. McClellan 2, J. M. Johnson 3, Rev. C. Reimann 3, Dr. J. Levergood 4, C. C. Schwelb 7, W. S. Shirk 2, S. W. Raub 7, J. W. Byrne 4, J. Ochs 1, Geo. Darmstetter 2, Wm. McCoussy 1.

Comparing the attendance for the past month with the attendance previous to the cold weather, and finding the falling off in the lower grade primaries in Manor street, in Miss King's school on Ann street, and in the primary on South Mulberry street, I doubt this is due in part to the defective arrangement for heating these buildings.

I also found that the S. Prince street, Manor street and the S. Mulberry street schools were without water, and as far as I know this is still the case.

Believing that it would be interesting to the members of the board to know the cost of instruction by the single room plan, and also by the old plan of combined schools, I have made the calculation, made by taking as my basis the average attendance for the past month in the primary schools. There have been in average attendance in the single room schools 585 pupils at a cost of \$391.35, or \$0.67 per pupil per month.

In the combined study-hall and class room schools 900 pupils at a cost of \$380.10, or \$0.42 per pupil. Assuming the cost in the single room schools as the basis, the combined school is 17 per cent higher.

In the principal primary grade there have been in the single-room school 827 pupils at a cost of \$288.50, or \$0.35 per pupil. In the combined study-hall and class room schools 1,134 pupils at a cost of \$0.85 per pupil; reckoning as before, the cost in the combined is 12 per cent greater than in the single room schools.

TRYING A MURDER CASE.

INVESTIGATING THE MYSTERIOUS DEATH OF CHARLES BENTLY.

Fifty-Five Jurors Called Before a Jury Was Selected—The Deadly Pistol Shot That Rang Out After Midnight—Why Bently is Suspected.

Thursday Afternoon.—When court re-assembled at 2:30 o'clock, the sheriff made return of the special venire to summon thirty jurors, which was with Bently, Berkheiser and Fry. A venire of Emanuel Berkheiser, for the murder of Charles Bently, was proceeded with. A number of jurors were then called. Some had conscientious scruples, others had formed and expressed an opinion, and a few were called in and examined. The venire was called. Three were challenged preemptively by the commonwealth, sixteen preemptively by the defendant, and twenty-four were challenged for cause by the commonwealth. The following is the jury selected to try the case: Jacob M. Ely, justice, Paradise; Jason K. Ely, merchant, Leacock; Levi S. Gross, farmer, East Hempfield; Geo. F. Kabler, tobaccoist, Manor; Henry L. Lutz, laborer, Lancaster township; John J. Pennell, farmer, Lancaster; W. Romig, drover, Ephrata; A. G. Seyfert, clerk, Germantown; Jacob F. Warfel, laborer, Manor; Charles F. Wertz, farmer, Dr. H. B. Perry, druggist, city, and Christian J. Galt, reporter, city.

The prisoner is represented by B. Frank Eshelman, Jr., of York. Dr. F. H. Hostetter is associated with the district attorney for the commonwealth. The opening was made by Mr. Hostetter, who outlined what the commonwealth proposed. He stated that on the night of July 24, 1884, there were a number of cattle moored at the wharf between 12 and 1 o'clock at night four men were seen standing on the third tier of boats and Charles Bently was in the first boat. These four men were identified as Bently, Berkheiser and Fry. Bently was seen to be evidently heard from, for he raised himself up and walked toward the center of the boat, as if to get a better view of the wharf and Bently fell; Berkheiser at this time, it is claimed, was standing on a boat within shooting distance, while his companions were on a pier of the wharf.

After the shooting Berkheiser, it is alleged, said he had done the best he could. A physician was called to examine Bently, who was dressed and he was conveyed to the county hospital, where he died on the night of July 25. The commonwealth further claimed that when Berkheiser and Fry, the companions of Berkheiser, accused him of shooting Bently, he did not deny it and a few days afterwards he confessed to the shooting. Berkheiser admitted that he had shot Bently.

The first witness called was Daniel A. Hoffer, who was coroner in 1884. He testified that he examined the body of Charles Bently, and that he found a bullet wound in the median line of the abdomen, 1 1/2 inches below the umbilicus, and 1 1/2 inches above the navel. The bullet was 1 1/2 inches in diameter and extending through the thickness of the anterior wall of the abdomen. Within the abdomen were evidences of recent peritonitis, and the stomach and intestines contained three pints of blood, with a few clots; the nature of the exterior wound indicated that it was from a bullet, although the wound was not a true bullet wound, and the wound was not a true bullet wound.

How a Negro Criminal Was Lynched. A month ago, near Monroe, in Union county, N. C., Altee Staten, a negro, committed a criminal assault on Annie Bancum, a little white girl, about 9 years old. Staten was arrested the day the outrage was perpetrated and put in jail in Monroe. The girl suffered greatly from her injuries and died on Thursday last. The people organized during the day and at 3 o'clock on Wednesday morning there was a knock at the jail door and the sheriff was told that they had a man who had committed the crime. The sheriff went to the jail and presented pistols at the door of the jail, and the man was taken out and hanged to a tree. The man was lynched.

Mr. Blaine and Father Clarke. On Thursday after the funeral of Mrs. Walker, in Baltimore, Hon. James C. Blaine met Father Clarke, S. J., and their meeting, though for the first time, was very cordial. During the first major Walker's family, of which Mr. Blaine's mother was a member, lived in the city, and Father Clarke was their spiritual adviser, and he has spoken with them of the baptism and confirmation of Mr. Blaine. Holding Mr. Blaine by the hand, after some conversation, Father Clarke said: "Your sister had a strong belief that you would one day return to the fold of the Catholic church, the one universal apostolic church, and she has been waiting for you for many months ago to convert forward, no doubt, to a very different sect than that from which you have been separated. But now, Mr. Blaine, you have Holy Writ for saying that it is better for a man to go to the house of mourning than to the house of feasting and merriment."

FELL THIRTEEN FEET.

THE SERIOUS ACCIDENT THAT OVERTOOK JACOB C. STONER.

Precipitated Through a Floor and Breaking His Right Wrist and Two Fingers of His Right Hand—Finger Piece of Mechanism—Borough Brief.

COLUMBIA, March 6.—An accident took place yesterday on the old Stricker farm, at the borough limits, which resulted in serious injuries to the proprietor, Mr. Jacob C. Stoner, well known in Columbia. Mr. Stoner had gone to the hay mow, and while there stepped on a loose board. He fell through to the floor below, a distance of about thirteen feet. The right wrist and two fingers of the right hand were broken, and other more or less painful injuries were received about the head and hips. The accident occurred about two o'clock.

STRIKING RAILROADERS.

Freight Trains Not Allowed to Pass Through the Yards at Port Worth.

At 7 o'clock Thursday morning the men employed in the Texas Pacific and Missouri Pacific railroads at Port Worth struck work. All switch and freight engines in the yard were killed and to-night sixteen dead engines are around the round house. Thursday morning all east-bound freight trains were side-tracked in the yards, their engines being killed. The trains were not allowed to pass through the yards. The passenger trains will not be molested. The strikers are in groups, discussing the situation, but are orderly. About three hundred loaded and empty cars stand motionless on the track. A train load of California cattle is on the track, and a number of cattle are among the detained freight.

In the evening the strikers received news that several freight trains from the north would arrive. They assembled at the north end of the yards intending to side-track the trains. The strikers were intercepted by wire and turned back toward the yards. The strikers are holding meetings to determine what further steps to take to force the strikers to accept their demands.

The Applicants for Political Place. There are about nine applicants for borough supervisor, three for solicitor and one for clerk of council. England and Egypt. The signs of discontent among the native population in British Egypt are increasing. Threats against the life of General Stephenson, the English commander, are now frequently heard, even on the streets.

The Egyptian press, continue to manifest a hostile attitude toward the British authorities. The flogging of natives for assaults upon English soldiers are of almost daily occurrence.

Prince Bismarck's object, the Gazette avers, was to state the real facts as to Germany's position in regard to Egypt, so as to retain the confidence of foreign countries. Turkey, France, Russia, and Germany have been seriously shaken, if Prince Bismarck had advised England to take Egypt.

Assaulted by a Newspaper Man. Richmond Pearson, a member of the North Carolina legislature from Buncombe, during a debate on Wednesday said in reply to a question "why he had not noticed a certain newspaper article" that he had noticed that "it was unworthy of notice." The article was written by Rufus W. McCade, of Charlotte, who later in the day met Pearson on the street and assaulted him. On Wednesday night the House adopted a resolution of inquiry into the facts of the assault, appointing a committee to consider and report as to the duties of the House in regard to protecting a member.

The Illinois Senatorial Meeting. In joint convention of the Illinois legislature on Thursday, the members and 145 reporters and correspondents were present. The Republicans voted, giving Logan 90 and Washburne 1. Acting Speaker Kimbrough then announced the joint assembly immediately adjourned. The Republicans objected that he had no authority to do so, and raised a pandemonium for a time, until the doorkeepers were ordered to clear the House, whereupon they retired.

The Costleville Iron Mills. The postponed sale of the personal property of the Costleville iron company took place on Thursday. The rig, from brought, on an average, about \$15.00 per ton. The mills, or a portion of them, will be started between now and the 1st of April under the management of Mr. W. C. Carmichael, with the former superintendent. The new firm will take the name of the Costleville iron works.

CHILDREN HORRIBLY BURNED.

A Can of Oil and Turpentine Explodes.

Thursday evening Frank Kunkle, a German, teamster, living in Grant alley in Allegheny City, placed a stove to boil a mixture of turpentine and kerosene, which had been told would cure his horse's lameness. In the room at the time besides Kunkle was his daughter Annie, aged seven months, and a young man named Depp. The mixture had been on the stove for some time, when it boiled over. Instantly it ignited and a second explosion occurred, which scattered the scalding liquid and flames in all directions.
