Death of the Hon. Walter Forward. We have to record to-day the death of two of Pennsylvania's most eminent men, JOHN SARGENT of Philadelphia, and WALTER FORWARD of Pittsburgh. The latter died on the 24th inst. in the 67th year of his age.

Judge FORWARD was in the township of Aurora, Portage county, when the Western Reserve was a wilderness, and soon emigrated to Pittsburgh on foot, to read law in the office of Judge Baldwin, of that city.

We copy from the Gazette a brief sketch of Mr. FORWARD's public life, which will be read with interest by many who knew, respected and loved this truly great and good man:

Mr. FORWARD was a native of Connecticut, where he received a liberal education. He took up his residence in this city, in 1803, and studied law with the late Henry Baldwin. In December, 1805, after the decease of the first editor of the "Tree of Liberty," a Democratic paper published in this city, he undertook the editorship for the proprietors, and discharged that duty for several years, thus early giving promise of those abilities for which he afterwards became so eminent.

From 1806 to 1822, he was engaged in the practice of law in this city, during which time he acquired great eminence at a bar which was graced by some of the first men in the country. In 1822 he took his seat in Congress, having been elected to the House of Representatives as the successor of Henry Baldwin. He continued to represent the district until March, 1825. Mr. FORWARD was a member of the Congressional caucus which nominated Mr. Crawford, the last ever held in this country. He himself supported Gen. Jackson, to show his opposition to that mode of making Presidential nominations. In the great contest between Adams and Jackson, he supported Mr. Adams, and has ever since been numbered among the most distinguished members of the Republican Whig party.

The next public position in which we find Mr. FORWARD, was in the Convention to reform the State Constitution, held in 1837. In this Convention he bore a distinguished part, and was noted for his firm and persistent defence of the great principles of human rights.

In March, 1841, he was appointed by Gen. Harrison, United States District Attorney for the Western District of Pennsylvania, but declined the appointment and a few days afterwards received the appointment of the First Comptroller of the Treasury, which he accepted, and held until he was appointed Secretary of the Treasury by Mr. Tyler. While at the head of the Treasury Department, the Tariff of 42 was enacted, to which result he greatly contributed by his able and convincing report on that subject.

On retiring from Mr. Tyler's cabinet, he resumed and continued his practice at the bar until appointed by General Taylor as Charged Affairs to Denmark, where he spent several years, and resigned that honorable situation to return home to accept of the office of President Judge of the District Court of Allegheny county, a post of great responsibility and importance, to which he had been elected by his fellow citizens.

He was on the bench on Monday last, when he was taken suddenly ill, and lingered, with various symptoms of his disease, inspiring hope and fear in the breasts of his friends, until he expired on Wednesday morning.

This chore is but a meagre and rapid sketch of Mr. FORWARD's public life. Of his private life, of his character, and uncommin' exaltations of character, of his incorruptible honesty, his nature, could overcome, of his long and heroic struggle with comparative poverty, and of his shining domestic virtues, we cannot now speak. They are written in the hearts of his children, his friends, and fellow citizens. Through a public career of nearly fifty years, he made no enemies; no stain is attached to his character. He has passed away amidst the sincere tears and regrets of his whole community.

As a pleader at the bar and as a stump orator, Mr. FORWARD had few equals. His public labors during the campaign of 1840 and 1844, were of the most effective and powerful character. His eloquence was of that strong and earnest cast which bore down all opposition, and convinced the hearer that the speaker himself felt the truth of every word he uttered.

Mr. FORWARD was a firm believer in the great truths of Christianity. Some years ago, he became a member of the Methodist Protestant Church. Whether this relation was continued up to the time of his decease, we have not learned.
