HOADLY AT HAMILTON.

On his return from attending a meeting of the Democratic State Central and Executive Committee, held at Toledo, Judge Hoadly stopped off at Hamilton on the evening of July 7th. He was met at the depot by the leading Democrats of the city, with a band of music, and escorted to the residence of Hon. James E. Campbell, and in the evening addressed an immense meeting in the German Society Hall.
