REINFORCED.

READ LETTERS.

It is estimated that the cost of advertising the letters which are sent to the dead letter office, not being delivered, will be \$60,000 a year. This is an entire loss to the Department.

If a large portion of advertised letters were delivered, this expense might, the Department believes, be justified by advantage according to public interests. It is a fact that at least seventy per cent of the advertised letters are sent to the dead letter office. In some of the larger offices the per cent is less than fifteen per cent. In view of these facts the Postmaster General has deemed it expedient to rescind his instructions to Postmasters under Section 4 of an act approved March 31, 1865. Every Postmaster is required to notify publishers of advertised letters of his office that hereafter, for reasons above stated, only one cent per name will be paid for such advertising.

It is not possible to effect his arrangements to have the list published in the newspaper having the largest circulation. At this rate Postmasters will thus cause lists to be printed and posted publicly as a substitution for newspaper publication. It is provided that the entire expense of such printed lists shall not exceed one cent per name. If neither of these arrangements can be effected, he will merely post manuscript lists, for which no charge will be allowed.

RAILROAD ACCIDENTS.

NEW YORK, Aug. 31.

The Herald prints a complete list of railroad accidents attended with loss of life or injury to persons, which has occurred during the commencement of the year. In no quite slight number of cases, but in twenty-eight casualties, by which two hundred and sixty-six persons have been killed and 1,169 wounded; this is only the number of killed and wounded recorded at the time of the accident, and who died shortly after. Of course many of the wounded were but slightly injured, but how many died after weeks of suffering from wounds received, we shall probably never know.
