ATTEMPT AT FRAUD.
 Yesterday great excitement was produced in this city, by a fraud which it is alleged was attempted to be practised. The following particulars and accompanying letter will disclose the nature of the alleged fraud:
 One of two persons arrived from Baltimore a few days since, learned from Mr. George Riston, broker of this city, that Madison Jeffries, high constable of Baltimore, had written to him to procure 500 men to proceed to that city to vote at the election for Mayor on Monday next. Yesterday morning Messrs. Hudson and Pratt arrived from Baltimore and communicated the facts to a number of citizens here, who immediately made exertions to detect the fraud. Mr. Henry Gideon, of Spring Garden, passing himself off as a workman at Girard college, and as one of the same party, went to Mr. Riston and had some conversation upon the subject. Mr. Riston read the following letter, and Gideon, availing himself of an opportunity, possessed himself of it, and thus the whole affair was disclosed. The letter below is a true copy of the original.
 "BALTIMORE, Oct. 6, 1840.
 Dear Sir: I had a talk with our friends this morning, who informed me that you can send us 500 men here for the Mayor's election next Monday week. If you can possibly do so, use every exertion to do it, for, as regards the Mayor in Baltimore, it is all important to the Electoral vote in the State.
 The men that you send ought to hail from this city as far as possible.
 You will also see the importance of this when you take that since the taking of the last census the Council to be elected now will have the division of the wards; if they get it they may cut it up in such a manner as to prevent us from ever getting this city again.
 If you should come to any conclusion in this matter, be kind enough to write me immediately.
