

One most remarkable fact is worthy of special notice. During a great part of Monday, the streets of New York were filled with from 150,000 to 200,000 people, with no armed police, no gens d'armes, to keep them in order, and yet there was no rioting, no disturbance, no noise, no disorder. The people were their own police. In Boston there may be even double the number assembled—and there, as here in New York, of the most heterogeneous political character—yet will there be no police, or gens d'armes, required to keep them in order and prevent disturbance. There is a moral sublimity in all this, which not only does honor to our institutions, but to which no parallel can be found in the other nations of the world.—N. Y. Her-ld.

ARREST UNDER THE NEW TREATY.—Christina Cochran, Alias Gilman, who is accused of having murdered her husband in January last, near Paisley in Scotland, by administering arsenic, arrived at New York on the 22d inst, and was arrested under the new treaty, having been demanded by the British Government, through an agent who came out in the Acadia.

LIFE IN THE SOUTH.—A bloody affray took place on the 13th inst. at Lexington Court House, (S. Carolina.) between a Col. Caughman and a Dr. Benjamin, the latter drew a knife and stabbed him in nine places. Caughman is not expected to live. The Editor of the Vicksburg, (Miss.) Sentinel was lately shot dead, in a street fight with Dr. Adams.

ESCAPE OF SLAVES.—The Canada Mission have published their annual report, in which they state that, during the year 1842, fifteen hundred slaves escaped from their masters in the United States, and are now in Canada.

The town of Sterling, at Rock River Rapids, Ill., was visited, about 12 o'clock on the night of the 3d inst., by a thunder storm of unusual violence. The dwelling house of Mr. Charles Judd was struck with lightning, and Mr. J. instantly killed.
