nearly 100,000,000. The wealth of the world is about \$450,000,000,000. The wealth of the United States is about \$150,000,000,000. We have only a sixteenth of the population, but we have a third of the wealth of the world. And it has practically all of it been amassed since the Civil war. It is wholly the result of Republican policies of protection for wage earners and industries. We have about 19,000,000 wage earners who receive \$15 a week on an average. England has 9,000,000 of the same class of wage earners. They average \$6.25 a week. Nine out of ten of England's population die penniless—it could hardly be otherwise—and 60 per cent of all who live to be 70 years old are buried by charity. England is the ideal free-trade nation of the earth. Mr. Wilson and Mr. Bryan, by combining their political forces have foisted upon this nation, against its will as always expressed by majorities at the polls, a policy as near free-trade as they could accomplish. And yet the wealth and prosperity of the United States is the result of a continued policy of protection and the only difference between the wage earners of England and America is the difference between free-trade and protection.—San Diego Union.

A Little Question of Service.

The President is entirely confident that "the people of the country have been served by the members of this Congress as they have seldom, if ever, been served before."
 He is pretty nearly right. Back in the administration of President Cleveland the country was served by a Democratic Congress in much the same way. The near-free-trade tariff law of that time created disaster and played havoc with the industries of the United States.

But Wilson has gone a step further than did Cleveland. The latter was content with near-free-trade. He did not pile on direct taxes to make good the deficiency. He did issue bonds, to be sure, but the people were not taxed. It has remained for Wilson to give the country direct taxes, and the \$100,000,000 atrocity is but the beginning in that line if Democratic policies are endorsed at the coming election. On the whole we quite agree with the President that the country never has been served by a Congress as it has been by this one under his absolute control—Philadelphia Inquirer.
