

CITY NOTES.

The election over, we should now give every exertion to the advancement of the interests of Great Bend and Barton county. In politics there are divisions, but in matters that pertain to the prosperity of our city there should be unity of opinion and action. We need another railroad. We now have an opportunity to secure one. Shall we embrace it?

The opera house will soon be completed and we hope it will be given to a manager who will give us first-class entertainments. We believe that the Great Bend public will give a generous support if the entertainments are up to the standard.

The bond election will occur on the 7th of next month. The friends of Great Bend—those who wish to see her prosper—should go to work earnestly and see that the bonds carry and by a majority that shall be emphatic.

A three-story brick hotel costing \$30,000 to \$40,000 is something Great Bend is sorely in need of. We have good hotels, as good as can be found in this part of the state, but we need something larger and more imposing that shall represent the enterprise and growth of the city. Nothing does more to advertise a town than good hotel buildings. They are standing advertisements.

It is said that the Larned street car line is paying. We have many advantages over Larned in this respect. First, our depot is fully a half mile from the business portion of town, second, most of the travel is confined to one street. If the Larned line pays why can't we have a line? Let us investigate the matter at any rate.

The G. A. R. Hall will soon be completed. It is a very neat structure and does credit to the organization. The first floor will be made into an elegant store room.

The vote in the city on the 2nd inst. was not as large as expected. The falling off was due to the neglect of the provisions of the registration law. All who have not registered should do so at once as there will be another city election on the 7th of December to decide whether the city shall extend aid to the Missouri Pacific.

Cy Lafferty, the colored man who burned his wife to death at Leavenworth last week and who was brought to the Wyandotte county jail to prevent lynching, died at 5 o'clock yesterday morning from wounds in his throat incurred while attempting self destruction since his confinement. The body was immediately shipped to Leavenworth for burial.—K. C. Times.

SOUTH BEND.

He was given until the next morning to sober up when he was taken before Judge James and assessed \$10 for the benefit of the city. As he had not the necessary change, he was given a short time to leave the city, which he did at once.—Border Ruffian.
