OUR SIDE OF IT.

The reason we oppose J. N. Dunbar's candidacy for the office of county attorney is because he rendered an opinion at one time which we considered then and do now an injustice to the taxpayers of Baxter Springs.

Mr. Dunbar was the referee before whom was tried the case of the Baxter Springs Light and Power Company against the City of Baxter Springs.

In order to save time and space we shall refer to the Baxter Springs Light and Power Company as "The Warners." They really composed the company.

The Warners were granted a franchise for an electric light plant in this city. They never did comply with the terms of the franchise, yet a few city administrations did put up with their foolishness. Finally the city refused to pay for the lights unless the franchise was complied with and all night service given.

The franchise allowed the Warners to use free water power at the river to run their plant, yet under the franchise they were to bear their share of the expense of keeping the power in repair. Well, finally the Warners sued the city for their light bill. During the time intervening between the filing of the suit and its trial the Warners offered to compromise the suit for about \$700, which was about half what they asked. The Warners well knew that the city had a valid offset claim of several hundred dollars for repairs at the dam, and that they had never paid their share of it, as they agreed to do under their franchise. The city, knowing the Warners' claim was an unjust one, refused to compromise and the case went to trial before J. N. Dunbar as referee.

Mr. Dunbar has told us that he rendered a judgment for the Warners under the ordinance granting the franchise. And just think of it! He gave them twice what they asked. What we want to know in this: If he could give the Warners a judgment for their claim under that ordinance, why could he not give the city the benefit of its offset claim under the same ordinance.

Our idea of it is this: The Warners had several Columbus lawyers hired to keep track of their troubles. These lawyers needed money. If the Warners could get a judgment against the city of Baxter on their claim the lawyers would get an assignment of that judgment and thus get something for their work. This may not be true, but this is the ink wasn't dry on that judgment until the Warners' attorneys filed a lien against it.

But here is where we are somewhat sore: Mr. Dunbar didn't know just how to decide the case, so he talked it around among some lawyers who were interested in the Warners getting a verdict and we believe he allowed them to influence him.

The case was appealed to the supreme court, however, and it is our honest opinion that the city will win out.

Now, we don't think that either Mr. Dunbar or his opponent, Mr. Bulger, know any too much about law, but we propose to vote for Mr. Bulger because we think he is the best man for the place.

Mr. Dunbar is not entitled to the vote of a single taxpayer in Baxter Springs, and he won't get many.
