ANOTHER BANK.

On Wednesday afternoon of this week a large number of the business men of Baxter Springs and several of the substantial farmers of this vicinity held a meeting for the purpose of organizing a banking institution. Mr. F. S. Hall of Fulton, Kansas, was present, and he will be the principal stockholder of the new bank. Mr. Hall is at present engaged in the banking business at Fulton. He is an old friend of A. W. Abrams of this city, who at one time lived at Fulton.

Many speeches were made relative to the matter of starting a bank. Some wanted a national bank, while others wished a state institution. It was explained that a state institution could be started quicker than a national, and that if afterward it was deemed expedient to nationalize it could be done.

A motion was made and carried that a state bank with a capital stock of \$10,000 be organized, and a committee was appointed to solicit subscriptions to stock. The committee at once went to work and within fifteen minutes the ten-thousand mark was passed. A motion to reconsider was made and it was decided to make the capital stock \$15,000. Of this amount \$13,400 was subscribed at the meeting and several persons who were not present at the meeting sent in word that they wanted stock. So the bank is a go.

Those present at the meeting felt sure that the organization of another bank will result in bringing more business to the town and that is what is wanted. Certain it is that the investment of more money in the community will not hurt it.

As to who the officers of the new institution will be we do not care to hazard an opinion at this time.

THE CONTRACT LET.

At a meeting of the county commissioners held the other day a contract was given J. H. Sparks of St. Joseph, Mo., to build a bridge over Shoal creek at Lowell. The contract calls for two spans of 127 feet each, to be set upon steel tubes and stone abutments. Work is to be commenced on or before Jan. 15, 1901, and be completed on or before March 10, 1901. The contract price is \$3,950, but this does not include payment for approaches. This will be good news to the people of this part of the county.
