WOULD MAKE PERMANENT U. S. EMPLOYMENT SERVICE


Secretary of Labor Wilson Issues Statement of Plans for Establishment of Co-operative System in Which Government Would Aid States in the Work

Secretary of Labor Wilson has recommended to congress the enactment of legislation creating a permanent public employment service for the United States.

"In my judgment, the duty of maintaining a system of labor exchanges is primarily one which rests upon the municipality and the state.
