Opponents of legislation providing for regulation of the meat packing industry were heard today when the Senate agricultural committee resumed consideration of the subject.

William T. Nardin of St. Louis, manager of a milk condensery, objected to federal licensing on the ground that the other industrial establishments would be required to submit to regulation. The situation from the retail butchers' standpoint was presented by Emmanuel Washburn of Norfolk, Va.

Protests Against Measures. Theo Davis Hill, head of the Baltimore packing house, produced a letter of protest against regulation measures, asserting it was not possible to hamper the efficiency of the packers, "without corresponding injury to livestock producers and consumers."

speakers declared was an organization whose main purpose is the aggrandizement of the British empire and the return of the United States to the status of an English colony. The features of the annual banquet of the Annual Order of Hibernians and the Ladies' auxiliary, held at the Pilsen hotel last night.

In a ringing address, Attorney James E. Murray placed Montana's senator on the gridiron and told of an exchange of letters between himself and Walsh relative to the Irish question. Walsh, said Mr. Murray, had written the latter a letter in which he denounced President De Valera of the Irish republic, forming him a foreigner who undertook to discuss American affairs, to wit, America's proposed participation in the league of nations, before American audiences.

A Foreign Document. Attorney Murray said that in his reply to the senator he had called that individual's attention to the fact that the league of nations covenant was a foreign document drafted by foreigners, and that President De Valera, in his attacks on the league, was speaking for 20,000,000 American citizens.

Attacks Overseas Club. During the course of his address, Attorney Murray attacked the Overseas club, which he said had membership in Montana, and characterized the organization as a "managing American lobby." The attorney stated that he had recently had occasion to read the oath of membership in the Overseas club, which, he said, pledged its members to uphold the British empire above all other nations and to always help insofar as was possible in maintaining British supremacy on land and sea and in the air.

Mrs. Mary Johnston, state president of the Ladies' auxiliary, spoke briefly on the necessity of organizing auxiliary divisions of the Hibernians and the auxiliary. Miss Catherine Harrington, state secretary, touched on the subject of closer unity between the two branches of the Hibernians' organization.

Others who spoke included State Chaplain the Rev. Father T. Maroney, M. J. Roddy, state secretary of the A. O. M., and the Rev. Father M. J. English of Whitehall.

Opening of Conventions. The annual convention of the Hibernians and the auxiliary began yesterday morning with a special high mass at St. Joseph's church in which the Rev. Father McDonald officiated as celebrant, with the Rev. Fathers O'Shea of Butte and Meade of Philadelphia as deacon and sub-deacon, respectively. Fathers English and Leonard acted as acolytes. A special sermon was delivered by State Chaplain Maroney.

Following the church services the two organizations repaired to Hibernia hall in Centerville where the conventions were formally opened with joint exercises. In the absence of State President Joseph McDonald State Secretary Roddy opened the convention. Addresses of welcome and replies were made and M. P. Mahoney of Anaconda was elected permanent chairman of the convention. Mr. Attorney Edward Fitzpatrick of Butte, vice-chairman.

Following the joint session the business sessions of the Hibernians were continued at Hibernia hall while the members of the auxiliary adjourned to the Knights of Columbus hall, where their sessions are being held.

ABOUT LIVING EXPENSES.

Calagren, Aug. 21. Attorneys for the meat packers in the packing house employees' wage hearing told Judge Samuel Aleschler, federal mediator, that living expenses had shown a decrease since last February and cited rents in the stockyard district which they said had in many instances been increased but little.

The packers' counsel invited the judge to make a tour of the stockyards district and see for himself how the workers there lived. They counsel for the workers urged the judge to inspect the homes of the heads of Armour & Co., Swift & Co., and Morris & Co., and see how they lived.

Mrs. Anna McQuillan, who submitted a budget of necessary living expenses fixed at more than \$1,300 a year as compiled in June, was asked the source of her figures. She refused to divulge the names of her informants because she said the information was given her in confidence.

avoided a direct exploration by stating "by the city." Johnson accordingly was placed in a cell and booked as "held for the city."

City Authorities Not Implicated.

Investigation by the Bulletin on Tuesday developed the fact that the city authorities knew nothing of the arrest of Johnson and had no hand in it. A statement denying that Morrissey was an official of the police department was obtained from Chief of Police Murphy who asserted that Morrissey had not even visited the city police headquarters "even during which it was ascertained that Morrissey was in disgrace. A telephone number over four distance by Chief Murphy revealed that the Bureau authorities knew nothing of any arrest by Bozeman officials in Butte. Inquiries at the sheriff's office on Tuesday first brought out denials from the under sheriff and a number of the deputies of any knowledge of Johnson's arrest. Later conflicting statements by the deputies led to further investigation by the Bulletin during which it was ascertained that Johnson at that time was in a cell in the county jail, from which he was not released until about 5 o'clock Tuesday evening.

Drunk As Usual.

From a number of witnesses of his appearance at the Bennett hotel on Monday night, the Bulletin has ascertained that Morrissey was stag getting and was evidently under the influence of liquor when at the hotel. It was also ascertained that the two men supposedly from Bozeman, who were with Morrissey, re-entered the hotel lobby alone and with drawn faces forced Johnson to accompany him.

The Bulletin also ascertained from officials at the county attorney's office that at 8:30 o'clock Monday evening Morrissey was staidly drunk and was in the care of two companions who were assisting him to navigate. The Bulletin has also ascertained that Morrissey was seen staggering north on Idaho street in an intoxicated condition at 3 o'clock on Tuesday morning.

The charges filed against Morrissey by the county attorney's office in connection with his illegal arrest of Johnson and one more charge of his unsavory legal history. As city detective and later as chief of city detectives Morrissey's reputation for brutality toward helpless prisoners in the city jail was a by-word among policemen and citizens generally.

Was Not Exonerated.

Last March following the death of Mrs. Morrissey, charges of brutality toward his wife, culminating in her death under circumstances which caused a coroner's inquest in to the causes of her death because of the big sensation in Butte. Although Morrissey was not held directly responsible for Mrs. Morrissey's death by the coroner's jury, neither did the jurymen exonerate him, but returned an open verdict which still leaves the question of filing charge

of manslaughter against Morrissey in the hands of the county attorney Always Broad.

Brutal treatment of prisoners at the county jail, and brutal conduct toward a number of peaceful citizens who were acting as Dunmuthers at the city polling places on the night of the municipal primary election led to the filing of charges against the officer before the police trial board. After a week of testimony the board recommended that Morrissey be summarily dismissed from the police force, which action was taken by Mayor Stedden. Since his dismissal from the police force, the only time that Morrissey had entered the public eye until his high-handed acts on Monday night, was when an announcement was made that he had been temporarily employed as a special officer at Bozeman during the "Hins" convention here last week.

Accused of Killing Wife.

Several months ago when Morrissey applied for letters of administration of his late wife's estate, his sister-in-law, Mrs. Margaret Jackson, filed a protest in which she alleged that Morrissey had repeatedly cruelly beaten his late wife and ended up with the direct charge that he had killed her. The petition was presented by Mrs. Jackson at the hearing on the petitions he heard before a jury. Morrissey through his attorneys, has been consistently fighting that provision, seeking to have the hearing on the Morrissey estate held by the judge in chambers.

that convicted defendant, that wife-beater and alleged wife killer, Morrissey, in "arresting" Johnson and throwing him into the county jail was a high-handed act of piracy for which Morrissey should be arrested and imprisoned.

We affirm that through the attempt of Mr. O'Rourke's officers to shield Morrissey from the fruits of his piracy, and through their assistance accorded him, by "arresting" and booking him in jail approximately 18 hours an absolutely no charges whatever, Sheriff O'Rourke and his officers are equally culpable with Morrissey and should be subjected to proceedings to determine their guilt and if found guilty should be removed from office.

Attempt to Shield Morrissey.

And in the knowledge of all these things Sheriff O'Rourke, who is a public official, and his underlings as to the public generally, the fact remains that Sheriff O'Rourke, through his assistance, aided and abetted Morrissey in his illegal kidnapping of the stranger, Johnson, and further assisted the drunken former city detective by attempting to shield him.

And it is further fact that any person, whether it is Sheriff O'Rourke or another who counts names Morrissey, in his drunken, brutal and brutal acts, against the guilty wife with Morrissey, morally, if not legally.
