

MEMORIAL VICTORY OF RECOLUOS AT SPRINGFIELD.

We have received a letter from a special

correspondent, dated the afternoon of the

23rd inst, from a point on the river, which we

do not deem it proper to mention, but which

mentions that the late General Grant had

just received a message from Gen. Jeff

Thompson, of Missouri, announcing that

Gen. Ben. McClellan had on Wednesday

last made an attack on Springfield, and

achieved a brilliant victory over the federal

forces who were strongly fortified at that

place under Gen. Lyon. It was represented

as a hard fight, and the loss reported at 600

from McClellan's command, against 900 of

the enemy, with many federal prisoners taken.

The further statement is made that after

their rout, the enemy was pursued, with what

success we are unable to learn.

Though usually denouncing the thousands

of warlike rumors that are daily flying

through the country as the natural con-

sequence of revolution, we are disposed to believe

the report of this victory, leaving ample

room, of course, for all exaggerations. One

reason for doing so, is simply based upon the

fact that the report is so confirmed as to

be almost beyond question. It is confirmed

by the fact that the late General Grant, at

Springfield, Gen. JACKSON, in his late speech

in this city, stated that such a move was com-

pleted, and was no doubt consummated at the

time he was speaking.
