THE AVENGERS OF BLOOD.

Terrific Sequel to the Ezell Tragedy - Bierfield, the Leader of the Negro Assassins, Meets with Retributive Justice - His Execution - How he Met his Death - Full and Correct Details of the Affair.

From the Nashville Banner. The report which reached here last Sunday concerning the terrible tragedy at Franklin the night previous, created much interest in this city. It was the first time since the Ezell case that a man of color had been executed for a crime of this nature.

About five weeks ago the person of a little girl named Ezell, living seven miles west of Franklin, was brutally outraged. Her father, immediately after hearing of the heinous deed, the relations of the little girl set out to look for the villain, but he was not to be found.

About midnight a party of men in disguise appeared at the jail and demanded the release of the prisoner who had been taken by the jailer, but not until the latter was forced to do so. They then left, taking the negro with them.
