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WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, November 12.—The Director of the Bureau of Statistics is preparing an elaborate report on statistics in the United States. It will exhibit the Federal, State, county, township and corporation taxation, and the whole sum of these various revenues now exceed seven hundred millions annually.

Another large number of visitors were at Gen. Grant's headquarters to-day. Secretary McCullough and Attorney General Evans this morning had a long interview with the President in relation to internal revenue matters.

The clearance and collection bureau were to-day counting the money received from the steamer Jacob Carter. The greater part of it was much cleared and sent to the Treasury. The remainder was burned to cinders. The entire sum was about \$200,000. Upwards of one-half of the denomination of the notes were taken for indemnifying owners and those responsible for the money.

Gen. Grant called at the Internal Revenue Bureau and had a pleasant interview of an hour's duration, with Commissioner Rollins.
