FROM BROWNSVILLE. Favorable Decision of the Franchise Case of State vs. Staten.

THE NEW ORLEANS CONVENTION. Resolutions of Condolence for Late President of Mobile Board of Trade.

Action Upon Report in regard to Removal of Obstructions from Mouth of Mississippi River.

Report of Memphis Commercial Convention on Pacific Railroad in Part Adopted.

NEW ORLEANS, May 27.—The delegation from the State of Alabama in the Commercial Convention adopted a series of resolutions expressing their appreciation of the admirable qualities of the late Col. L. T. Woodruff, President of the Mobile Board of Trade, who was killed at a recent fire, and their regret at his untimely decease.

Upon assembling this morning the Convention took up the report of the Committee on the removal of the obstructions from the mouth of the Mississippi. Without recommending any particular plan of operations, respectfully commended to the attention of the General Convention, the committee recommended that the New Orleans Chamber of Commerce upon the subject, and that while acknowledging the liberality of the appropriations, should, in view of the large accumulations of deposit within the past few years, earnestly urge the necessity of still further appropriations for continuing the work. They also recommended that the control be confided entirely to the United States Engineer Bureau, in which they express entire confidence. The report was adopted.

The following, which was embodied in both the majority and minority reports of the Pacific Railroad Committee, was adopted: That the main trunk line from San Diego, Cal., should be built through the junction of the River Colorado and Gila, along the valley of the Gila, and South of the same to El Paso, on the Rio Grande, and thence to a convenient point on the Colorado, west of the Brazos, at or near the river, in the State of Texas, to which main trunk feeder roads may be built from St. Louis, Cairo, Memphis, Vicksburg, New Orleans, or Galveston on the east, and Guaymas, Mazatlan and San Francisco on the western side, with equal rights of connection for all, which should be secured by the Government of the Southern Pacific Railroad. The discussion of the Pacific Railroad question was lengthy, and the longitudinal route from Cairo to Mazatlan strongly advocated by Texas and Illinoisians.

The Convention remained in session until 3 p.m., when it adjourned to meet to-morrow and to-day. A few departed this evening.

FROM BOSTON. Cruel Treatment of Slack on a Railroad Train—Meeting of the American Tract Society.

BOSTON, May 26.—A stock train arrived at Worcester, Mass., on Tuesday, from Albany on route to Providence, loaded with Texas cattle, which were found to be in a horrible condition. Two or three hundred head of cattle were found jammed into one car, two of which had apparently been dead some time. Two others were dead, and others were down and unable to rise while all were evidently starving and had apparently been without food or water for several days. The cattle were unloaded, and the carcasses were then put into fresh cars and set off on their way.

The fifty-fifth annual meeting of the American Tract Society of Boston assembled to-day, Senator Wilson presiding. Julius A. Palmer, the Treasurer, read his report, from which it appears that the debt of the society at the beginning of the year was \$17,485, and the payments and expenditures \$18,996.

THE SUPREME COURT HEARD FROM AT LAST. All Citizens of Tennessee Entitled to Vote of 1866 Entitled to Vote.

BROWNSVILLE, TENN., May 27.—The Supreme Court at Brownsville to-day decided on the franchise law. The Circuit Court of Weakley county had decided that neither the Legislature nor the Governor had power to set aside the restrictions made under the franchise law of 1866, and that all holding certificates under them are entitled to vote. The Commissioners registration of the franchise law, which affirmed the decision of the Circuit Court. This will largely increase the number of voters.

PROVIDENCE, May 27.—The Rhode Island House of Representatives passed, yesterday afternoon, nearly unanimously, a resolution that the General Assembly hold in high esteem the administrative ability of his Excellency, Gov. Ambrose E. Burris, and entertain unpaired confidence in his courage, patriotism and loyalty; and also hold in grateful remembrance the self-sacrificing gallantry of the officers and soldiers of Rhode Island during the late formidable rebellion.

FROM BALTIMORE. A Brutal Prize Fight Breaks Up in a Row.

BALTIMORE, May 27.—A prize fight took place between Heckler and Wm. Carroll this morning, in Pennsylvania, near the Maryland line. Four rounds were fought favorable to Carroll, when a crowd of heckler's friends rushed into the ring and broke up the fight.

FROM NEW YORK. The Quaker City—Heavy Frauds—Presbyterian Conference Committees, Etc.

NEW YORK, May 27.—It is stated that Minister Thurston informed Secretary Fish, yesterday, that the steamer Quaker City was the property of British subjects and was destined for Jamaica, Cuba, and other ports, and that the vessel was to be chartered by no person who her clearance should not be granted. The Secretary conferred with Secretary Post, and the two agreed to suspend the vessel to let her sail; but, in the meantime, information was received that she had been libeled by the Spanish Consul at Havana, and that she was to be seized by the Spanish authorities.

Kate Fisher, the actress, was in court yesterday on a charge of grand larceny, preferred by Mrs. Bevels, of Long Island, in having, it is alleged, stolen a watch worth two hundred dollars. She denied the act, and the case was postponed till Friday.

Scott & Munson, the absconding Wall street grain merchants, have swindled to a large extent, than was first reported. It is stated that they had received from the National Union League which met here yesterday, adopted measures to place in Virginia and other Southern States, and adjourned until July.

The Presbyterian Conference Committee on Home reported the basis of reunion this morning, which is that such reunion under the style of the Presbyterian Church in the United States shall be on a doctrinal and ecclesiastical basis; and that the New Testament be acknowledged as the inspired word of God, and the only infallible rule of faith and practice. The confession of faith adopted as the basis of the union is that of the several Presbyterians and their votes taken thereupon shall be sent to the next meeting of the two general assemblies, to meet in Pittsburg, the second Wednesday in next November, and if two-thirds of them be in favor of the Union, the two assemblies shall act accordingly, consoling committees and take other action for the interest of the church. The second Sunday in September is recommended as a day of prayer for the whole denomination.

In Old School Presbyterian Assembly to-day the Committee on Church Union made a report, of which a full synopsis has been seen. A concurrent declaration was also reported, which gives all ministers and churches the same standing in a united body, and says that all imperfectly organized churches must become thoroughly Presbyterian within five years. Boundaries of Presbyterians are to be established by the United General Assembly. An official record of the two branches is to be preserved, but no rule or precedent shall be established by either body, or established by the united body unless it affects the rights of property. The corporate rights of the two assemblies are to be consolidated as far as practicable.

The several committees and boards are consolidated impartially. The Board of Publication of the United Synods is to revise the editors so as to exclude injurious reflections.

The theological seminaries now under Assembly control may be transferred to the care of one or more of the synods, and it shall be the duty of all judicatories, ministers and people of the united church to preserve peace, and to be as consistent with convictions of duty, conform practice to the general custom of the church prior to the controversies which resulted in separation.

The report was accepted.

FROM NEW ORLEANS. Quarantine.—The Future of the Opelousas Railroad.

NEW ORLEANS, May 27.—Governor Warmoth has proclaimed a quarantine of not less than ten days against the following ports: Havana, Matanzas, Trinidad, Santiago de Cuba, Port Royal, Montego, Bay of Amalaga, Jacamar, Port-au-Prince, St. Domingo, the Islands of St. Thomas, Martinique and Guadeloupe, Camaguey, Yaguajay, Belise Honduras, Vera Cruz, Alamo, Tampico, Matamoros, Tuxpan Mexico, San Juan Nicaragua, Chagres, Aspinwall, Porto Bello, Maracaibo, Venezuela, Guayana, Island of Trinidad, Rio Janeiro, Para, Cayenne and Nassau.

Charles Morgan, the purchaser of the Opelousas railroad, in a long public communication announces a readiness to co-operate with the business men of Texas, Louisiana, or any other section of country, interested in extending the Opelousas Railroad from New Orleans to Texas by the most eligible route, and proposes that a new corporation be formed, and obtain the remaining franchise of the New Orleans, Opelousas and Western Railroad Company, with a cash capital of four millions, of which he himself will take and pay the cash for two millions of the stock provided the same amount will be raised by any other parties. He further gives assurances of his intention to put the road promptly completed in repairs, and if necessary to make it a double track.

FROM ATLANTA. A Member of the Press in Trouble—Explosion of an old Shell, Killing Four Men.

ATLANTA, Ga., May 27.—The Grand Jury has found a true bill against J. Clark Swasee, editor at Macon, for a high misdemeanor. The bill is predicated upon an inflammatory article appearing in his paper some weeks ago, and is based upon that section of the Code that forbids any person to circulate any writing that incites to violence to forbid authority, insurance, or conspiracy against citizens.

After the death of Dr. Ayers, by a negro near Savannah, Swasee published an inflammatory article calling on Union men to organize for self-defense. The penalty is imprisonment in the Penitentiary from ten to twenty years.

This morning four men at the Atlanta Rolling Mill on opening an old shell ignited the powder, when the shell burst, killing them all.

NASHVILLE. The New Postmaster—Election Returns—East Elected Chancellor.

NASHVILLE, May 27.—Ems Hopkins the newly appointed Postmaster, assumed the duties of the office to-day. An election for the judges of the Supreme Court, and other courts, took place to-day. The Republican nominees for the Supreme Court had no regular opposition, and are undoubtedly elected.

The election of Chancellor in this district results in the choice of East, a moderate Republican, over Rexford, a Radical. The returns are not all in, but Rexford's friends concede East's election by several hundred majority. The vote in the city was very close between East and Rexford. Major was scarcely known in the race. A number of the most intelligent and influential Radicals of Northern birth supported East.

FROM ROCHESTER. Disgusting Case of Body Snatching.

ROCHESTER, May 27.—A disgusting case of body snatching has just occurred at Williamson, Wayne county. Stephen Burton, a respectable citizen, died on Wednesday last from an over dose of chloroform, and was buried on Friday. It was suspected that his grave had been robbed and it was examined. The body had been dragged from the coffin and mutilated, and was found concealed in the woods near by. Dr. Brent, of Ontario, and two medical students have been arrested and held to answer for the crime.
