Special to the Memphis Appeal.

NASHVILLE, TENN., June 23.—In the Senate the Railroad Investigating Committee submitted the report of said committee relative to the bonds issued by the State to the Memphis, Clarksville and Louisville railroad company. On motion of Mr. Cooper, of Bedford, 200 copies of the report were ordered to be printed, for the use of the Senate, and the subject matter of the report recommended to the committee, with instructions to report by letter or otherwise what action on the part of the General Assembly is necessary for protecting the State's interest. The report shows that from March 18, 1868, to July 12, 1869, bonds of the State amounting to \$1,320,000 were issued to the Memphis and Clarksville and Louisville Railroad Company, and that the amount of debt due the State from said railroad company is \$2,400,142. The State is eighty-three miles in length, and the State has advanced in bonds and interest \$4,320,000 per mile, and yet, says the committee, the road has never paid into the State Treasury a single cent on any account whatever. They recommend that the same action be taken by the Legislature or through the duly authorized officers of the State to either sell the road or make such equitable consolidated running arrangement with its connecting roads as will secure to said road equitable property for the rate of the general earnings and to secure a general settlement between the former receivers of the road and the State. They also advise an adjustment of the different claims between this company and the Louisville and Nashville railroad company growing out of the Hudd's creek disaster, and all other questions arising out of the contract between the two companies.

HEAVY FAILURE.
