On motion of Mr. Self, the vote relating to the House bill to regulate the tax on billiard and Jenny Lind tables was reconsidered and the bill referred to the Judiciary Committee. Passed.

In the House a report was submitted from John A. Gardner, State's agent for the Nashville and Northwestern railroad, ordered to be transmitted to the Senate.

Mr. Stiles, from the Committee on Finance and Ways and Means, reported the general appropriation bill for the expenses of the present General Assembly.

After various amendments had been adopted, the bill passed its last reading, by ayes 82, nays 10.

House resolution requiring the Commissioner to issue his warrant to different counties in place of money—Tennessee—that has been burned belonging to those counties for school purposes. Adopted.

The Senate bill directing the Attorney General to bring suit against all railroads, and the bill providing for the regulation of the bonds of the State, passed a third reading. Also, Senate bills defining the powers and duties of the Attorney General and Reporter of the State. Passed.
