The Population of the United States in 1870 Compared with the Population in 1850.

From the Washington Chronicle. From official figures obtained at the Census Office we are enabled to present to-day the total population of the United States according to the returns of the ninth census. To this preliminary report we have appended the population of the States and Territories in 1850, and a column showing the percentage increase since the taking of the eighth census.

REMARKABLE GROWTH OF CITIES. The above table shows a remarkable increase in Jersey City, Chicago, and Memphis, all western cities with the exception of the first named.

The population of the United States in 1870 was 3,437,213; the numerical gain in the past ten years is, therefore, 7,401,523. The population of the United States in 1850 was 23,129,725, and the numerical gain in the ten years following was 15,728,512.

THE AMERICAN PRIVILEGE. LONDON, February 1.—A dispatch from Bordeaux says that Gambetta telegraphed the President that he will announce the date when he will leave the French Government after communication with Parnell, who is to come to Paris. Meanwhile, he asks that he be firm and confident, and instructs them to drill incessantly all recruits in the army.

Another dispatch from Versailles mentions that firing was heard in the Belleville and Vallet quarters of Paris yesterday. It is feared that disturbances have occurred.

It is reported that the armistice has been extended to the Eastern departments, and that military operations on the part of General Mansfield, Worder, Bourbaki and Gambetta cease to-day.

THE TERMS OF PEACE. LONDON, February 1.—A special telegram from Berlin says the conditions of peace proposed by Bismarck to Favre embrace the position of Alsace and Lorraine, with Belpoit and Metz, the payment of ten million francs as indemnity for the expenses of the last war, and the cession of the colony of Pondicherry, and the transfer to the German Empire of the whole of the island of Madagascar by rebel emigrants, fitted out in British ports, and various other conditions.
