LITTLE ROCK, February 18.—Great excitement prevails over the proceedings of the Legislature and Supreme Court to-day.

To avoid an announcement of the articles of impachment against Clayton, the majority in the Senate refuse to meet, and leave that body without a quorum.

CLAYTON'S MEN WILDEST.—The Clayton Minority filibustered for some time, until the Supreme Court could reach a judgment of ouster in the Johnson *vs. Edwards* case.

It was a race for time between the court and the House, but the latter was victorious.

The court was finally forced to adjourn until Monday morning to consider a motion of the respondent for a jury to lay the issues of fact before.

JOHNSON TRIUMPHANT.—This was regarded as a triumph for Johnson and the people over the programme of the ring.

In the meantime the impachment proceedings, by suspension, were placed an embargo upon the Court until it was removed by trial and acquittal.

It is still threatened by Clayton's friends that he will not recognize his suspension, and will resist Johnson's assumption of power.

THE SUPREME COURT AND JOHNSON.—The Supreme Court has issued an order, restraining Lieutenant-Governor Johnson from the exercise of his Executive functions, which is made one of the grounds of McClure's impachment.

NO CONFLICT—ARMS READY.—As yet there has been no conflict, although much misapprehension is felt.

Two wagon-loads of arms were stored in the State House to-day, which were brought from the United States Arsenal.

REPUBLICAN GOVERNMENT WANTED.—A motion was made in the House by W. B. Padgett, to memorialize Congress for a republican government pending the present troubles.

NEW YORK, February 18.—A Cuban sympathizer named Ryan, alias himself "General-in-Chief of Cavalry of the Republic of Cuba," has written an address to the citizens in the United States, and he has been heretofore impeached of high crimes and misdemeanors in office, and he is hereby suspended from exercising further the functions of his office, as provided by the Constitution of the State of Arkansas.
