Address of the Tennessee Centennial Commissioners.

The completion of the first century of our national existence is to be celebrated by holding an international exhibition of arts, manufactures and products of the soil and mine.

The five principal buildings for the exhibition are now in course of erection upon a tract of four hundred acres.

1. The industrial hall, or main building, eighteen hundred and seventy-six feet in length, by four hundred and thirty-four feet in width, constructed mostly of glass and iron.

2. The art gallery, or memorial hall, three hundred and sixty-five feet by two hundred and ten, a fine-proof structure of granite, glass and iron.

3. The agricultural hall, of six acres. 4. The machinery hall, of fourteen acres. The classification of objects in these buildings provides a plan for a complete and systematic arrangement.

5. The division between these departments runs lengthwise of the building, crossing them at right angles. The divisions between nations, thus, one who wishes to study some particular product or manufacturing process.
