THE STORM. Additional from Missouri, Iowa and Illinois—The Burial of the Dead—Property Destroyed.

TERRIBLE EFFECTS OF THE Big Blow in Europe—Fearful Destruction of Houses in and About Peck.

ST. LOUIS, March 13.—Accounts of the storm high pass, which struck the northeastern Missouri Friday say the city of Shoukey, in Monroe county, was entirely demolished. Two persons were killed and several injured. The results of the late storm in Missouri: Seven persons killed and seven injured, three or four of them dangerously. Some property was blown down, and in some damage done to orchards and timber. It is estimated that in Monroe and Baldwin counties, one hundred and fifty thousand dollars' worth of property was destroyed. Five miles north of Monroe, at the time of the hurricane a terrific storm passed leaving a trail of death and covered with eight or ten feet of snow.

ENGLAND. LONDON, March 13.—The storm of Sunday did much damage at Portsmouth, Weymouth and other ports. Six hundred vessels took refuge in the Downs. The mail-boat from Galata and the Orford were compelled to leave their respective ports. The mail-boat from Havre for New York, was detained at Plymouth some hours. The storm extended to the continent. The telegraph wires in the north of France were prostrated, and communication between Paris and London interrupted. A telegram from Peck to New says that the storm in the Downs shows no signs of subsiding. The storm is increasing. A large dam has burst, and fifty thousand persons are homeless. In some places, several villages, are inundated.

ALONG THE DANUBE. BUDA-PEST, March 13.—Five small towns along the Danube five hundred and twenty-five persons escaped from the seventh to the thirteenth inst., in consequence of the foundations being damaged by floods. In Peck and its suburbs, work was taken up by the gale, and five hundred persons were killed. Four hundred square miles of winter corn has been lost to Hungary. The foundations of houses in Budapest, being undermined, are in danger of falling. In the inundated places, large blocks of ice were seen. The large islands were submerged, and all houses, except lead, were awry.

HAZEL GREEN. DUNDRECH, March 13.—The damage to property in the Hazel-green district was very great.
