projections, but enlightened statesmanship is far above resorting to the tricks of the law demagogue. The best way to reduce our taxes is to increase our wealth, which never can be done if we commence a system of repudiation. In 1789, reports which have been received in every instance in which it has been a most costly experiment, indicating far more damage than the amount repudiated. Let us accept the best terms our creditors may offer; but we cannot afford to repudiate to secure favorable terms. Tennessee cannot afford to sacrifice her fair fame and solid interests, and every honest man, with the blood of a Tennessee flowing through his veins, and the pride of Tennessee swelling in his breast, will gladly accept such terms as her creditors may propose, but will never consent to degrade their State by first repudiating a just indebtedness to force a dishonest compromise.

THE PARAMOUNT QUESTION. The defeat of Radicalism, the restoration of peace, honesty and economy in the administration of the government, are the absorbing issues in the Presidential election. There are discissions in the Democratic party, but they will subside after a candidate has been nominated at St. Louis. There are divisions on the currency question, but these must be reconciled and our differing views harmonized in order to achieve the great object in view—the defeat of Radicalism. The south has been buffeted for ten years by Radical usurpers. She has been wrecked and deplored by the imperial power of the President, who has debased his office and lost the powers of the great Republic to the villainous adventures who, like vultures, have been preying upon the interest and property of the people, and even upon the liberties of many persons in the south. We want to see honest government established; we want to see the safeguards which the law and constitution throw around the citizen and his rights of property bulwarked by the action of the people of the whole country. So soon as the rights of the southern people shall have been assured by the election of a Democratic President, we can then discuss the currency question. The national Democracy cannot afford to squabble about any minor issue when the great, vital, living question is the defeat of Radicalism. The country desires nothing else so much as a change of administration, and this result cannot be accomplished by shameful quarrels about immaterial issues. A change is the country's only hope. Retrenchment, honesty and reform are words unknown in the Radical vocabulary, and unless there is a marvelous change in their nature, never will be. From the first hour of its advent to power the Republican party has been notorious for its reckless expenditure of public money. That characteristic has thoroughly permeated it. From the head of the government down to the most obscure State or municipal official, the same spirit of extravagance has prevailed, and it would be as rational to expect the leopard to change his spots or the Ethiopian the color of his skin as that party to change its habits of wastefulness and dishonesty. The experiment has been so fully and so fairly tried, and it has been tested in so many different directions, and under such varied conditions, and with the same result, that to look for retrenchment at its hands is as futile as the endeavor "to alter sunbeams from cucumbers." There is but one hope for the country, and that hope lies in a change of administration—not a mere change from Grant to Morton, or Blaine or Conkling, or any of the other Presidential aspirants, but a change that will bring with it a return to some administrative policy that will drive the leeches now in power from their hold upon the purse-strings of the people, and to inspire in those who have heretofore been the friends and practical advocates of an economical administration of the government. The Philadelphia Chronicle truly says that until such a change is brought about we shall have a continuation of the present unhappy state of affairs. Our industries will remain paralyzed, our workmen will be without employment, enterprise of all kind will be palsied, and inevitable and widespread ruin will follow. Elect either of the now prominent Republican candidates, and what assurance will the country have that there will be reform in a single governmental department? None whatever. Every individual of them has been, and still is, a supporter of the principles and policy that have brought the country to its present desperate extremity. Blaine may steal Grant's and Morton's thunder, Conkling and Morton may unite against Blaine and Brewster, and each may fight the other with tiger ferocity, but the inspiration is the same in all. They are all tarred with the self-same stick—all move on the same plane, all run in the same groove. The change demanded is of a more radical character. It is a change that will bring about results the opposite of those we are now experiencing, and it requires no prophetic ken to understand that such a change can never be wrought under the auspices of the present leaders of the Republican party.

SPORADIC DEMOCRACY. The Avalanche is seized with one of its spasmodic fits to become a Democracy. The attempt, like others, will soon be relaxed, and our neighbor will be found running in his old Bourbon "ruts" and "grooves," abusing the Democratic party, the resolutions of 1868, old politicians, and then supporting such juveniles as Andrew Johnson and Bill Allen. The Avalanche says it will support Allen or Hendricks, if nominated at St. Louis, but will oppose Tilden as the Democratic nominee. Lucky Tilden! Unfortunate Allen! Doomed Hendricks! The status of the Avalanche indicates to Democrats their duty in the present emergency. This paper is as essential to the Democracy as the chronicler of the Democratic party, and its sentiments and interpretations should be as some people interpret their dreams—by contradictions. In a word, if ever, in the mutations of parties Democrats begin to lose their landmarks they must go against the tide occupied by the Avalanche.
