The Steamer City of San Francisco Stove in and Sunk by an Obstruction Believed to have been Formed by Recent Earthquakes.

All her Passengers and Crew Saved through the Heroic Conduct of Captain Waddell and his Officers.

Her Valuable Cargo, Estimated at Three-quarters of a Million Dollars, and the Passengers' Baggage and Valuables Lost.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 30.—A San Diego correspondent of the Associated Press telegraphs as follows: "At two o'clock this morning the Pacific Mail steamer City of San Francisco, bound for San Francisco, was wrecked on the coast of California. The vessel was carrying a cargo of three-quarters of a million dollars, and a crew of one hundred and thirty-seven passengers.
