


**A CRAFT THAT CAN ALMOST BURN THE WAVES**

Charles R. Miller, Delaware's chief executive, and the cream-colored hat in which he inspected the rifle range at New Castle.




**MANEATER CAUGHT ON LINE**  
William S. Gale and the 6½-foot shark he took from the water near the inlet at Atlantic City after a long battle.




**QUARTET OF PLAYERS WHO ARE STARTLING THE GOLFING WORLD**
