TEUTONS HURL BIG ARMIES AT RIGA AND VILNA

Fall of Czar's Naval Base Matter of Days—Railway Centre Menaced by Drive DVINSK ALSO IN DANGER

BERLIN, Sept. 14.—Cutting of the Vilno-Petrograd railway in three places has opened the way for strenuous prosecution of the Teutonic campaign in the north. Great armies are being hurled at Riga, the Czar's seaport base, and Vilna, the dominating railroad centre in the northern sector.

EARLY EVACUATION OF VILNA NECESSARY, SLAVS ADMIT

Foe's Losses in Two Months 465,000, Petrograd Estimates

PETROGRAD, Sept. 14.—Evacuation of Vilna will follow the cutting of the Vilno-Petrograd Railway, it was semi-officially admitted today. The Germans have reached the railway midway between Vilna and Dvinsk, severing the rail communication between the Russian forces concentrated about these two centres. One German army is pressing eastward north of Vilna and another moving eastward from the region of Dvinsk.


