Rosforth as the hair-shirted trapper has a role eminently suited to his forceful but rather heavy methods. There is a certain lack of delicacy in his acting which robs the character of the nobility it might have had...

Whonah, the Indian girl whose blind devotion to and jealousy of Koo-tah-nan results in the tragedy at the end.

The photography is excellent, especially the scenes along the rocky waterways of this wonderful north country.

The most interesting detail of the picture is the long scene in which the trapper is a rustic frame with pine cones and pine around it, while the words are in the blank verse rhythm of Hiawatha.
