HOSPITAL BAZAAR TOMORROW

Flags of Two Nations Will Mingle at Affair for Tokio Institution

Last-minute touches are being put today on the Christmas bazaar and amateur cabaret show for the benefit of St. Luke's International Hospital, Tokio, Japan, which will be held tomorrow at the Ritz-Carlton.

The most brilliant and representative gathering of society at a charitable affair held in this city for some time will be the feature. The number of prominent men and women who have devoted their attention to the details assures the success of the enterprise.

The sale of tickets has been large and the number of reservations of tables for supper parties has exceeded the expectations of the Rising Sun committee, which is arranging the affair.

An international spirit between the nations, which Dr. Rudolph P. Touster, superintendent of the hospital at Tokio and nephew of Mrs. Edith Galt, the President of the friendly spirit between the nations, has been cemented by the establishment of the hospital.

The amount expected to be raised at the bazaar is \$7500 for a children's ward. The Japanese Emperor has contributed personally \$25,000 to the general hospital fund, and Prince Okuma, the Premier, and other Cabinet members have given \$50,000.
