RESCUE FORCE AT WORK

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Feb. 7.—Several thousand persons are homeless as the result of floods in southeastern Arkansas.

All of yesterday the 200 men who remain in Arkansas City toiled in an effort to strengthen the levee against the fast rising waters.
