WASHINGTON, March 13.—President Wilson has promised to take a hand in the fight over the Shields waterpower bill...

His letter intimates a veto for the Shields bill unless it is radically amended.

He is making a fight against people who thoroughly realize the immense fortunes to be made out of the control of these common assets.

Without fear of contradiction, I again state that for influence and oblique work the water power crowd are the shrewdest and most dangerous people that we have to fight in the country today.

It is inherently necessary that there should be a fight about what will happen if a bill goes before you that does not fully protect the public interest, and one in such a nature that the injustice may be continued through an indefinite term.
