The 335 yards down the slope, Gardner was on the green with a 19-foot putt for a two.

Several holes were conceded back and forth. Evans, however, had a penalty shot. Chick Evans on the twelfth and Bob Gardner on the sixth.

On the second, 513 yards, both Gardner and Evans were far up the fairway on their drives, and using their brains shot to the edge of the green.

Ninth hole, 170 yards—Evans pitched dead a yard from the ninth pin, while Gardner pitched into the woods on the hill.
