


**EARLY MARRIAGES FAVORED BY NOTED BIOLOGIST HERE; CALLS TWO CHILDREN ENOUGH**



Dr. Thomas W. Galloway, of Beloit, Advocates Single Moral Standard and Says Women May Enforce It—Dubious About Birth Control

In a day when Emma Goldman and others anarchistically, feministically and temperamental inclined say harsh things about marriage in general and youthful marriage in particular, it is refreshing to find a modernist who expounds with the vigor of conviction a few of the old-fashioned notions.  
Dr. Thomas W. Galloway, of Beloit College, Wisconsin, who has been delivering a series of lectures on sex hygiene at the University of Pennsylvania, a man who might be described either as a scientifically sentimental or as a sentimentally scientific, does this. His old-fashioned conclusions, however, are reached from modern premises.

**WOMEN HOLD POWER**  
Just as though he weren't a biology expert of an advanced type, he believes not only in marriage, but in very early marriages. He believes that the upholding of a high standard of morals lies chiefly with women; that man will be good if every mother and daughter of us conspires to make and keep him good by demanding that he be good.  
Doctor Galloway is so interested in advancing to the young men of the country his theories on the spiritualization of sex relations that he has obtained leave of absence from his college to address the young men of the large eastern universities.  
"I believe in a single standard of morals," he told me, "and that is the woman's standard. The ideal of the woman of the country should be higher, and I tell the boys to whom I talk that it is not honorable for them to expect of the girls they are going to marry more decency than they themselves possess."  
"Our young people should marry earlier. It is impossible to set an age, but I believe they should marry just as soon as they have acquired the things that make for a successful marriage. These are the power to appreciate a good man or good woman, faithfulness and self-mastery."

**HOW YOU CAN MAKE YOUR OWN BEAUTY POWDERS**

THE powder puff is in great demand these days. Every woman realizes that it is next to impossible to keep her skin fresh and clean-looking without the aid of this warm-weather friend. The increased activity of the pores, in some instances, keeps the skin constantly coated with an oil which gives it a shiny, greasy appearance, which is the bête noir of the woman of refinement. Therefore, she keeps her dressing-table well stocked with toilet powders of every variety, and is extravagant in their use during the warm days.

There are many excellent powders purchasable in the shops, but many women prefer to compound their own favorite recipes. With many, this mixing of toilet preparations has become a hobby—one, in my opinion, decidedly worth cultivating.

Talcum powder occupies first place on the dressing table at all times. You will find the formulas for two very excellent talcum powders below. It is a simple matter to blend the ingredients if, after mixing, the powder is sifted four or five times through fine bolting silk or coarse muslin.

- TALCUM POWDER**
- Rice flour ..... 10 ounces
  - Talcum ..... 10 ounces
  - Oil of stic ..... 10 ounces
- HYGIENIC TALCUM POWDER**
- Perfume to your taste.
  - Hygienic starch ..... 20 grains
  - Powdered talcum ..... 20 grains
  - Powdered lycopodium ..... 20 grains
  - Rubol or boric acid ..... 10 grains
  - Essence of violet ..... 20 grains
- Another powder, **SP** on your dressing table should be filled with orris powder,



which the dainty woman will find a delightful addition to her toilet preparations. It contains the following ingredients:  
**ORRIS POWDER FOR PERSPIRATION**  
Essence of violet ..... 2 fluid drams  
Eau de cologne ..... 2 fluid drams  
Starch ..... 2 fluid drams  
Flour of orris ..... 2 fluid drams  
Essence of violet ..... 2 fluid drams

Dissolve the acid in the eau de cologne, add the violet essence, then the starch and orris root. This powder can be used to advantage on perspiring hands, and is an agreeable glove powder.

There is a splendid powder for perspiring feet which persons afflicted with this annoyance find an invaluable addition to their toilet remedies. It is made of the three ingredients printed below:

**POWDER FOR PERSPIRING FEET**  
Salicylic acid ..... 20 grains  
Boric acid ..... 1 dram  
Talcum powder ..... 1 ounce

Soak your feet with warm water to which a tablespoonful of powdered borax has been added. Dust the feet with the powder, and sprinkle a little of the powder inside your shoes.

One of the most popular formulas in my collection of toilet powders is the following:

**POWDER OF WHITE GERANIUM**  
Starch powder ..... 4 pound  
Powdered orris root ..... 15 drops  
Oil of geranium ..... 15 drops

Blend the starch and orris root, crushing it free from lumps. Add the perfume a drop at a time, and stir four or five times through bolting cloth or coarse muslin.

There are many times during warm weather when the hair becomes heavy with oil or perspiration, losing its fluffiness, and you wish that you knew of some preparation which would restore its lightness and beauty without having to give it a wet shampoo. There is no better dry shampoo than a powder made of:

Powdered orris root ..... 6 ounces  
Coke meal ..... 6 ounces

Dust this through the hair, using a talcum powder shaker, then brush the hair thoroughly with a brush having medium stiff bristles until the powder has been removed. The grease and dust are absorbed by the powder, and your tresses will be fluffy, clean and delicately perfumed.

This is a collection of toilet powders which deserves a place on every dressing table.
