

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Dessert Recipes That Save Eggs WHEN eggs are soaring in price try the waffles dessert. There are many excellent ones and other fancy desserts that can be made without eggs and not suffer a loss in their taste or richness.

EGGLESS WHITE LOAF One cupful of thick sour milk, one-half cupful of butter, one cupful of sugar, two cupfuls of flour, one cupful of chopped raisins, one teaspoonful of soda, one teaspoonful of cinnamon, one-half teaspoonful of cloves, one-half teaspoonful of nutmeg, a pinch of salt.

EGGLESS WHITE CAKE One cupful of butter, two cupfuls of sugar, one cupful of milk, three and one-half cupfuls of flour, one teaspoonful of baking powder, one teaspoonful of vanilla, a pinch of salt.

EGGLESS APPLE CAKE One cupful of brown sugar, one-half cupful of butter, one cupful of raisins, peaches; one cupful of apple sauce, unspiced; one cupful of flour, one-fourth teaspoonful of salt, one teaspoonful cinnamon, one-half teaspoonful of cloves, one teaspoonful of baking soda, a pinch of nutmeg.

EGGLESS PLUM CAKE One-half cupful of butter, one-half cupful of bread crumbs, two cupfuls of stewed prunes or cherries, four table-spoonsful of chopped almonds, four table-spoonsful of sugar, one-half cupful of milk, a dash of cinnamon and of cloves.
