
People Have Fanatical Faith in Final Success of Submarine War

It has helped to see the financial benefit in well-designed buildings, the increase in property values by relating out cities with a thought to the beautiful. It has made a high ethical standard of practice in the profession and has clarified the relations between the public and the architect by painstakingly arriving at a minimum schedule of charges for the services of an architect for various classes of buildings. This schedule has been adopted and is accepted without question by the Government, and by corporations and by individuals who have been brought into close touch with the working of the architect's office.
